1 AN ACT Relating to the definition of agency for purposes of early
2 learning programs; and amending RCW 43.215.010.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.215.010 and 2015 3rd sp.s. c 7 s 19 are each
5 amended to read as follows:

6 The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter
7 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

8 (1) "Agency" means any person, firm, partnership, association,
9 corporation, or facility that provides child care and early learning
10 services outside a child's own home and includes the following
11 irrespective of whether there is compensation to the agency:

12 (a) "Child day care center" means an agency that regularly
13 provides early childhood education and early learning services for a
14 group of children for periods of less than twenty-four hours;

15 (b) "Early learning" includes but is not limited to programs and
16 services for child care; state, federal, private, and nonprofit
17 preschool; child care subsidies; child care resource and referral;
18 parental education and support; and training and professional
19 development for early learning professionals;

20 (c) "Family day care provider" means a child care provider who
21 regularly provides early childhood education and early learning

1 services for not more than twelve children in the provider's home in
2 the family living quarters;

3 (d) "Nongovernmental private-public partnership" means an entity
4 registered as a nonprofit corporation in Washington state with a
5 primary focus on early learning, school readiness, and parental
6 support, and an ability to raise a minimum of five million dollars in
7 contributions;

8 (e) "Service provider" means the entity that operates a community
9 facility.

10 (2) "Agency" does not include the following:

11 (a) Persons related to the child in the following ways:

12 (i) Any blood relative, including those of half-blood, and
13 including first cousins, nephews or nieces, and persons of preceding
14 generations as denoted by prefixes of grand, great, or great-great;

15 (ii) Stepfather, stepmother, stepbrother, and stepsister;

16 (iii) A person who legally adopts a child or the child's parent
17 as well as the natural and other legally adopted children of such
18 persons, and other relatives of the adoptive parents in accordance
19 with state law; or

20 (iv) Spouses of any persons named in (a)(i), (ii), or (iii) of
21 this subsection, even after the marriage is terminated;

22 (b) Persons who are legal guardians of the child;

23 (c) Persons who care for a neighbor's or friend's child or
24 children, with or without compensation, where the person providing
25 care for periods of less than twenty-four hours does not conduct such
26 activity on an ongoing, regularly scheduled basis for the purpose of
27 engaging in business, which includes, but is not limited to,
28 advertising such care;

29 (d) Parents on a mutually cooperative basis exchange care of one
30 another's children;

31 (e) Nursery schools that are engaged primarily in early childhood
32 education with preschool children and in which no child is enrolled
33 on a regular basis for more than four hours per day;

34 (f) Schools, including boarding schools, that are engaged
35 primarily in education, operate on a definite school year schedule,
36 follow a stated academic curriculum, and accept only school age
37 children(~~(, and do not accept custody of children)~~);

38 (g) Seasonal camps of three months' or less duration engaged
39 primarily in recreational or educational activities;

1 (h) Facilities providing child care for periods of less than
2 twenty-four hours when a parent or legal guardian of the child
3 remains on the premises of the facility for the purpose of
4 participating in:

5 (i) Activities other than employment; or
6 (ii) Employment of up to two hours per day when the facility is
7 operated by a nonprofit entity that also operates a licensed child
8 care program at the same facility in another location or at another
9 facility;

10 (i) Any entity that provides recreational or educational
11 programming for school age children only and the entity meets all of
12 the following requirements:

13 (i) The entity utilizes a drop-in model for programming, where
14 children are able to attend during any or all program hours without a
15 formal reservation;

16 (ii) The entity does not assume responsibility in lieu of the
17 parent, unless for coordinated transportation;

18 (iii) The entity is a local affiliate of a national nonprofit;
19 and

20 (iv) The entity is in compliance with all safety and quality
21 standards set by the associated national agency;

22 (j) A program operated by any unit of local, state, or federal
23 government (~~(or an agency)~~);

24 (k) A program located within the boundaries of a federally
25 recognized Indian reservation, licensed by the Indian tribe;

26 ~~((k))~~ (l) A program located on a federal military reservation,
27 except where the military authorities request that such agency be
28 subject to the licensing requirements of this chapter;

29 ~~((l))~~ (m) A program that offers early learning and support
30 services, such as parent education, and does not provide child care
31 services on a regular basis.

32 (3) "Applicant" means a person who requests or seeks employment
33 in an agency.

34 (4) "Conviction information" means criminal history record
35 information relating to an incident which has led to a conviction or
36 other disposition adverse to the applicant.

37 (5) "Department" means the department of early learning.

38 (6) "Director" means the director of the department.

1 (7) "Early achievers" means a program that improves the quality
2 of early learning programs and supports and rewards providers for
3 their participation.

4 (8) "Early childhood education and assistance program contractor"
5 means an organization that provides early childhood education and
6 assistance program services under a signed contract with the
7 department.

8 (9) "Early childhood education and assistance program provider"
9 means an organization that provides site level, direct, and high
10 quality early childhood education and assistance program services
11 under the direction of an early childhood education and assistance
12 program contractor.

13 (10) "Early start" means an integrated high quality continuum of
14 early learning programs for children birth-to-five years of age.
15 Components of early start include, but are not limited to, the
16 following:

- 17 (a) Home visiting and parent education and support programs;
- 18 (b) The early achievers program described in RCW 43.215.100;
- 19 (c) Integrated full-day and part-day high quality early learning
20 programs; and
- 21 (d) High quality preschool for children whose family income is at
22 or below one hundred ten percent of the federal poverty level.

23 (11) "Education data center" means the education data center
24 established in RCW 43.41.400, commonly referred to as the education
25 research and data center.

26 (12) "Employer" means a person or business that engages the
27 services of one or more people, especially for wages or salary to
28 work in an agency.

29 (13) "Enforcement action" means denial, suspension, revocation,
30 modification, or nonrenewal of a license pursuant to RCW
31 43.215.300(1) or assessment of civil monetary penalties pursuant to
32 RCW 43.215.300(3).

33 (14) "Extended day program" means an early childhood education
34 and assistance program that offers early learning education for at
35 least ten hours per day, a minimum of two thousand hours per year, at
36 least four days per week, and operates year round.

37 (15) "Full day program" means an early childhood education and
38 assistance program that offers early learning education for a minimum
39 of one thousand hours per year.

1 (16) "Low-income child care provider" means a person who
2 administers a child care program that consists of at least eighty
3 percent of children receiving working connections child care subsidy.

4 (17) "Low-income neighborhood" means a district or community
5 where more than twenty percent of households are below the federal
6 poverty level.

7 (18) "Negative action" means a court order, court judgment, or an
8 adverse action taken by an agency, in any state, federal, tribal, or
9 foreign jurisdiction, which results in a finding against the
10 applicant reasonably related to the individual's character,
11 suitability, and competence to care for or have unsupervised access
12 to children in child care. This may include, but is not limited to:

13 (a) A decision issued by an administrative law judge;

14 (b) A final determination, decision, or finding made by an agency
15 following an investigation;

16 (c) An adverse agency action, including termination, revocation,
17 or denial of a license or certification, or if pending adverse agency
18 action, the voluntary surrender of a license, certification, or
19 contract in lieu of the adverse action;

20 (d) A revocation, denial, or restriction placed on any
21 professional license; or

22 (e) A final decision of a disciplinary board.

23 (19) "Nonconviction information" means arrest, founded
24 allegations of child abuse, or neglect pursuant to chapter 26.44 RCW,
25 or other negative action adverse to the applicant.

26 (20) "Nonschool age child" means a child who is age six years or
27 younger and who is not enrolled in a public or private school.

28 (21) "Part day program" means an early childhood education and
29 assistance program that offers early learning education for at least
30 two and one-half hours per class session, at least three hundred
31 twenty hours per year, for a minimum of thirty weeks per year.

32 (22) "Private school" means a private school approved by the
33 state under chapter 28A.195 RCW.

34 (23) "Probationary license" means a license issued as a
35 disciplinary measure to an agency that has previously been issued a
36 full license but is out of compliance with licensing standards.

37 (24) "Requirement" means any rule, regulation, or standard of
38 care to be maintained by an agency.

39 (25) "School age child" means a child who is between the ages of
40 five years and twelve years and is attending a public or private

1 school or is receiving home-based instruction under chapter 28A.200
2 RCW.

3 (26) "Washington state preschool program" means an education
4 program for children three-to-five years of age who have not yet
5 entered kindergarten, such as the early childhood education and
6 assistance program.

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
