1            AN ACT Relating to permitting the sampling of beer and wine at  
2 locations licensed to serve beer and wine for on-premises  
3 consumption; and adding a new section to chapter 66.24 RCW.

4            BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5            NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 1.**    A new section is added to chapter 66.24  
6 RCW to read as follows:

7            (1) Except as provided in RCW 66.24.170, 66.24.175, 66.24.363,  
8 and 66.24.371 any licensee authorized under this chapter to serve  
9 beer on tap or wine for consumption on the premises may provide  
10 samples of beer and wine free of charge for consumption on the  
11 premises.

12            (2) Each sample provided under this section must be two ounces or  
13 less. A licensee may provide a maximum of four ounces of samples per  
14 customer per day.
