- AN ACT Relating to the board of massage; amending RCW 18.108.025,
- 2 18.108.070, and 18.108.073; and adding a new section to chapter
- 3 18.108 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 18.108
- 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 In order to recognize prior education that is applicable to
- 8 licensure as a massage therapist or massage practitioner while
- 9 protecting the public, the board shall adopt rules to allow massage
- 10 programs that are approved by the board to establish transfer
- 11 programs that accept an individual's credits or clock hours from
- 12 schools that have not been approved by the board. "Prior education"
- 13 must be defined to include but not be limited to, credits or clock
- 14 hours from schools, colleges, and universities that are:
- 15 (1) Accredited by a national or regional accreditation
- 16 organization;
- 17 (2) Approved by a state authority with responsibility for
- 18 oversight of vocational programs; or
- 19 (3) Approved by a state agency that regulates massage programs
- 20 and is a member of the federation of state massage therapy boards.

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- 1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.108.025 and 2012 c 137 s 4 are each amended to 2 read as follows:
- 3 (1) In addition to any other authority provided by law, the board 4 of massage may:
- 5 (a) Adopt rules in accordance with chapter 34.05 RCW necessary to 6 implement massage practitioner licensure under this chapter, subject 7 to the approval of the secretary;

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- (b) Define, evaluate, approve, and designate those massage schools, massage programs, <u>transfer programs</u>, and massage apprenticeship programs including all current and proposed curriculum, faculty, and health, sanitation, and facility standards from which graduation will be accepted as proof of an applicant's eligibility to take the massage licensing examination;
- (c) Review approved massage schools and programs periodically;
- 15 (d) Prepare, grade, administer, and supervise the grading and 16 administration of, examinations for applicants for massage licensure;
 - (e) Establish and administer requirements for continuing education, which shall be a prerequisite to renewing a massage practitioner license under this chapter; and
- 20 (f) Determine which states have educational and licensing 21 requirements for massage practitioners equivalent to those of this 22 state.
 - (2) The board shall establish by rule the standards and procedures for approving courses of study in massage therapy and may contract with individuals or organizations having expertise in the profession or in education to assist in evaluating courses of study. The standards and procedures set shall apply equally to schools and training within the United States of America and those in foreign jurisdictions.
- 30 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.108.070 and 2012 c 137 s 10 are each amended to 31 read as follows:
- 32 (1) The secretary shall issue a massage practitioner's license to 33 an applicant who demonstrates to the secretary's satisfaction that 34 the following requirements have been met:
- 35 (a) Effective June 1, 1988, successful completion of a course of 36 study in an approved massage program, transfer program, or approved 37 apprenticeship program;
- 38 (b) Successful completion of an examination administered or 39 approved by the board; and

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(c) Be eighteen years of age or older.

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- 2 (2) Beginning July 1, 2013, the secretary shall issue a 3 reflexologist certification to an applicant who completes an 4 application form that identifies the name and address of the 5 applicant and the certification request, and demonstrates to the 6 secretary's satisfaction that the following requirements have been 7 met:
- 8 (a) Successful completion of a course of study in reflexologist 9 program approved by the secretary;
- 10 (b) Successful completion of an examination administered or 11 approved by the secretary; and
 - (c) Be eighteen years of age or older.
- 13 (3) Applicants for a massage practitioner's license or for 14 certification as a reflexologist shall be subject to the grounds for 15 denial or issuance of a conditional credential under chapter 18.130 16 RCW.
- 17 (4) The secretary may require any information and documentation 18 that reasonably relates to the need to determine whether the massage 19 practitioner or reflexologist applicant meets the criteria for 20 licensure provided for in this chapter and chapter 18.130 RCW. The 21 secretary shall establish by rule what constitutes adequate proof of 22 meeting the criteria.
- 23 **Sec. 4.** RCW 18.108.073 and 2012 c 137 s 11 are each amended to 24 read as follows:
 - (1) Applicants for the massage practitioner license examination must demonstrate to the secretary's satisfaction that the following requirements have been met:
- 28 (a)(i) Effective June 1, 1988, successful completion of a course 29 of study in an approved massage program or transfer program; or
- 30 (ii) Effective June 1, 1988, successful completion of an 31 apprenticeship program established by the board; and
 - (b) Be eighteen years of age or older.
- The board or its designee shall examine each massage 33 (2) practitioner applicant in a written examination determined most 34 effective on subjects appropriate to the massage scope of practice. 35 The subjects may include anatomy, kinesiology, physiology, pathology, 36 human behavior, massage theory 37 of and 38 hydrotherapy, hygiene, first aid, Washington law pertaining to the practice of massage, and such other subjects as the board may deem 39

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useful to test applicant's fitness to practice massage therapy. Such examinations shall be limited in purpose to determining whether the applicant possesses the minimum skill and knowledge necessary to practice competently.

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- (3) All records of a massage practitioner candidate's performance shall be preserved for a period of not less than one year after the board has made and published decisions thereupon. All examinations shall be conducted by the board under fair and impartial methods as determined by the secretary.
- (4) A massage practitioner applicant who fails to make the required grade in the first examination is entitled to take up to two additional examinations upon the payment of a fee for each subsequent examination determined by the secretary as provided in RCW 43.70.250. Upon failure of three examinations, the secretary may invalidate the original application and require such remedial education as is required by the board before admission to future examinations.
- 17 (5) The board may approve an examination prepared or 18 administered, or both, by a private testing agency or association of 19 licensing boards for use by a massage practitioner applicant in 20 meeting the licensing requirement.
