- 2 "(9)(a) The chief of the Washington state patrol must create a

- 5 position resources to prepare for large scale emergencies. In the 2017-
- 6 19 biennium, up to twenty-five percent of the amount authorized for
- 7 reimbursements for state fire services mobilization under chapter
- 8 43.43 RCW may be used for the costs of pre-positioning resources that
- 9 were used for the response to an emergency or disaster situation.
- 10 The chief of the Washington state patrol must submit a report to
- 11 the appropriate committees of the legislature by December 1, 2018,
- 12 that includes the following information for each emergency or disaster
- 13 in which resources were pre-positioned in anticipation of a disaster
- 14 or emergency predicted to exceed local capabilities, and reimbursement
- 15 was made under RCW 43.43.961:
- 16 (i) The type and nature of the disaster or emergency;
- 17 (ii) The reasons why the host jurisdiction and mutual aid resources
- 18 were predicted to be exhausted;
- 19 (iii) The additional pre-positioned resources provided under the
- 20 mobilization plan;
- 21 (iv) The cost incurred by the state patrol; and
- 22 (v) The amount of reimbursement made under RCW 43.43.961 to the
- 23 host jurisdiction and to each nonhost jurisdiction providing all pre-
- 24 positioned resources.
- 25 (b) The chief of the Washington state patrol must update the state
- 26 mobilization plan to account for the authorization to send resources

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1 in preparation of emergencies or disasters that are predicted to exceed

2 local resources."

EFFECT: Creates a Pre-mobilization Pilot Program within the Washington State Patrol that allows jurisdictions to be reimbursed for the pre-positioning of resources to prepare for large scale emergencies in accordance with the State Fire Services Resource Mobilization Plan.

FISCAL IMPACT: No net change to appropriated levels.

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
