1 On page 42 of the striking amendment, after line 34, insert the
2 following:

4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 409. A new section is added to chapter 28A.320
5 RCW to read as follows:

6 (1) Public schools may develop curricula that:

7 (a) Links student learning with engagement in seasonal or
8 nonseasonal outdoor-based activities, including activities related to
9 academic requirements in science, health and fitness, and career and
10 technical education; and

11 (b) Aligns with the essential academic learning requirements under
12 RCW 28A.655.070 that are a component of the state's instructional
13 program of basic education.

14 (2) Public schools that develop curricula under this section may
15 request authorization from the superintendent of public instruction as
16 provided in section 410 of this act to consider student participation
17 in seasonal or nonseasonal outdoor-based activities as instructional
18 days for the purposes of basic education requirements established in
19 RCW 28A.120.220(5).

20
21 NEW SECTION. Sec. 410. A new section is added to chapter 28A.300
22 RCW to read as follows:

23 (1) The superintendent of public instruction, subject to
24 conformity with application or other requirements adopted by rule,
25 shall approve requests by public schools as provided in section 409 of
26 this act to consider student participation in seasonal or nonseasonal

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1 outdoor-based activities as instructional days for the purposes of
2 basic education requirements established in RCW 28A.120.220(5).

3 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules to
4 implement this section."

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6 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any
7 internal references accordingly.

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EFFECT: (1) Authorizes public schools to develop curricula that links student learning with engagement in seasonal or nonseasonal outdoor-based activities and is aligned with the essential academic learning requirements.

(2) Authorizes public schools that develop the curricula to request authorization from the Superintendent of Public Instruction (SPI) to consider student participation in the activities as instructional days for the purposes of specified basic education requirements.

(3) Directs the SPI to adopt related rules and, subject to conformity with application or other requirements adopted by rule, to approve requests by public schools to consider student participation in seasonal or nonseasonal outdoor-based activities as instructional days for the purposes specified basic education requirements.

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
