3 "Sec. 1. RCW 43.70.512 and 2007 c 259 s 60 are each amended to
4 read as follows:

5 (1) Protecting the public's health across the state is a
6 fundamental responsibility of the state which is accomplished in
7 collaboration with local health jurisdictions and sovereign tribal
8 nations. With any ((new)) state funding of the public health system
9 ((as appropriated for the purposes of sections 60 through 65 of this
10 act)), the state expects that measurable benefits will be realized to
11 the health of the residents of Washington. A transparent process that
12 shows the impact of increased public health spending on performance
13 measures related to the health outcomes in subsection (2) of this
14 section is of great value to the state and its residents. In
15 addition, a well-funded governmental public health system is expected
16 to become a more integral part of the state's emergency preparedness
17 system.

18 (2) Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for the
19 purposes of ((sections 60 through 65 of)) this act, ((distributions
20 to local health jurisdictions)) the governmental public health system
21 shall deliver ((the following)) measurable outcomes((:

9 **Sec. 2.** RCW 43.70.514 and 2007 c 259 s 61 are each amended to
10 read as follows:

11 The definitions in this section apply throughout ~~((sections 60~~
12 ~~through 65 of this act)) this chapter unless the context clearly~~
13 ~~requires otherwise.~~

14 (1) "Core programs" means public health programs needed in every
15 community in order to protect people's health including:

16 (a) Control of communicable disease and other notifiable
17 conditions;

18 (b) Chronic disease and injury prevention;

19 (c) Environmental public health;

20 (d) Maternal, child, and family health;

21 (e) Access to and linkage with medical, oral, and behavioral
22 health care services; and

23 (f) Vital records.

24 (2) "Core public health ~~((functions))~~ services of statewide
25 significance" or "foundational public health ~~((functions))~~ services"
26 means ~~((health services that:~~

27 ~~(a) Address: Communicable disease prevention and response;~~
28 ~~preparation for, and response to, public health emergencies caused by~~
29 ~~pandemic disease, earthquake, flood, or terrorism; prevention and~~
30 ~~management of chronic diseases and disabilities; promotion of healthy~~
31 ~~families and the development of children; assessment of local health~~
32 ~~conditions, risks, and trends, and evaluation of the effectiveness of~~

~~borders of the local health jurisdiction))~~ essential capabilities and core programs that must be present in every community through the governmental public health system to effectively and efficiently protect and promote healthy individuals, families, and communities throughout Washington and:

(a) Are population-based prevention services or individual interventions that have significant population health implications;

(b) Require a consistent and uniform level of services throughout all communities in the state to protect the population;

(c) Have governmental public health as the only or primary service provider; or

(d) Provide the necessary organizational capabilities to support program services.

(3) "Essential capabilities" means the knowledge, skill, ability, and systems infrastructure necessary to support effective and efficient governmental public health services including:

(a) Assessing the health of populations through epidemiologic surveillance;

(b) Public health emergency planning;

(c) Communication;

(d) Policy development and support;

(e) Community partnership development; and

(f) Business competencies.

(4) "Governmental public health system" means the state department of health, state board of health, local public health agencies and boards, and the sovereign tribal nations of Washington.

~~((+2))~~ (5) "Local health jurisdiction" or "jurisdiction" means a county board of health organized under chapter 70.05 RCW, a health district organized under chapter 70.46 RCW, or a combined city and county health department organized under chapter 70.08 RCW.

(6) "Shared services" means a systematic sharing of resources and functions among state and local governmental public health entities and sovereign tribal nations to increase capacity and improve efficiency and effectiveness.

Sec. 3. RCW 43.70.516 and 2007 c 259 s 62 are each amended to read as follows:

~~(1) ((The department shall accomplish the tasks included in subsection (2) of this section by utilizing the expertise of varied interests, as provided in this subsection.~~

1 ~~(a) In addition to the perspectives of local health~~
2 ~~jurisdictions, the state board of health, the Washington health~~
3 ~~foundation, and department staff that are currently engaged in~~
4 ~~development of the public health services improvement plan under RCW~~
5 ~~43.70.520, the secretary shall actively engage:~~

6 ~~(i) Individuals or entities with expertise in the development of~~
7 ~~performance measures, accountability and systems management, such as~~
8 ~~the University of Washington school of public health and community~~
9 ~~medicine, and experts in the development of evidence-based medical~~
10 ~~guidelines or public health practice guidelines; and~~

11 ~~(ii) Individuals or entities who will be impacted by performance~~
12 ~~measures developed under this section and have relevant expertise,~~
13 ~~such as community clinics, public health nurses, large employers,~~

15 ~~(b) In developing the performance measures, consideration shall~~
16 ~~be given to levels of performance necessary to promote uniformity in~~

19 ~~standards of performance, and innovations in public health practice.~~
20 ~~The performance measures shall be developed to meet the goals and~~

25 ~~(c) On or before November 1, 2007, the experts assembled under~~

10 ~~local funding with such state-incented resources.))~~ Within the funds

11 appropriated, local health jurisdictions and the department shall
12 expand delivery of shared services to modernize and streamline the
13 governmental public health system. This expansion must begin with a
14 shared services project in the following two foundational public
15 health services:

16 (a) Epidemiology assessment; and

17 (b) Communicable disease monitoring and response.

18 (2) By October 1, 2018, the department, in consultation with
19 governmental public health systems and the entities described in (b)
20 of this subsection, shall develop a governmental public health
21 improvement plan.

22 (a) The plan shall include, at minimum:

23 (i) Activities and services that qualify as foundational public
24 health services as defined in RCW 43.70.514;

25 (ii) An assessment of the current capacity, unmet needs, and
26 current service delivery models to provide foundational public health
27 services;

28 (iii) Statewide models for shared services and a plan for further
29 implementation of shared services;

30 (iv) A comprehensive accountability structure including:

31 (A) An excellence assessment of foundational public health
32 operations every two years, with completed excellence assessments and
33 feedback reports transmitted to the relevant committees of the
34 legislature;

35 (B) A goal of achieving a sixty percent score within eight years
36 of its first excellence assessment;

37 (C) How, if a goal of a sixty percent score is achieved, an
38 excellence assessment will be conducted every four years; and

39 (D) How, if the department fails to achieve the goal of a sixty
40 percent score, the department will achieve certification under an

1 internationally recognized quality management system, such as ISO
2 9001, or its equivalent, within eight years of the first excellence
3 assessment;

4 (v) The cost of providing foundational public health services
5 statewide including the cost of improved service delivery models
6 identified in (a)(iii) of this subsection (2);

7 (vi) A funding allocation model to ensure foundational public
8 health services are provided across the state; and

9 (vii) Recommended schedules for periodic updates to the
10 definitions and cost estimates, evaluation of the effectiveness of
11 the governmental public health system, assessment of the degree to
12 which the governmental public health system is providing foundational
13 public health services, and reporting progress made by the state and
14 each local health jurisdiction toward improving health outcomes.

15 (b) The department shall develop the governmental public health
16 improvement plan in consultation with the expertise of varied
17 interests, including but not limited to:

18 (i) Local health jurisdictions and the state board of health;

19 (ii) The Washington state association of local public health
20 officials;

21 (iii) Individuals or entities with expertise in the development
22 of performance measures, accountability, and systems management, and
23 experts in the development of evidence-based public health or medical
24 practice guidelines; and

25 (iv) Individuals or entities who will be impacted by performance
26 measures developed under this section and have relevant expertise,
27 such as community clinics, public health nurses, large employers, the
28 sovereign tribal nations of Washington, other state agencies, health
29 services providers, and citizens concerned about public health.

30 (c) The performance measures must be developed to ensure
31 foundational public health services are available statewide and to
32 meet the goals and outcomes identified in RCW 43.70.512. The measures
33 must:

34 (i) Reflect best scientific evidence, national standards of
35 performance, and innovations in governmental public health;

36 (ii) Establish the levels of performance needed to achieve core
37 public health services delivery for each local health jurisdiction
38 and the department; and

39 (iii) Describe the resources necessary to meet the performance
40 levels.

1 (3) For purposes of this section, "excellence assessment" means
2 an assessment of agency operational performance by a trained national
3 or state examiner using an excellence framework published by the
4 national institute of standards and technology, United States
5 department of commerce.

6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. RCW 43.70.520 (Public health services
7 improvement plan—Performance measures) and 2007 c 259 s 64 & 1993 c
8 492 s 467 are each repealed.

9 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. If specific funding for the purposes of
10 this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not
11 provided by June 30, 2017, in the omnibus appropriations act, this
12 act is null and void."

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13 On page 1, line 1 of the title, after "services;" strike the
14 remainder of the title and insert "amending RCW 43.70.512, 43.70.514,
15 and 43.70.516; creating a new section; and repealing RCW 43.70.520."

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
