- 5 The following information relating to fish and wildlife is exempt 6 from disclosure under this chapter:
- 7 (1) Commercial fishing catch data from logbooks required to be provided to the department of fish and wildlife under RCW 77.12.047, 8 9 the data identifies specific catch location, timing, methodology and the release of which would result in unfair 10 competitive disadvantage to the commercial fisher providing the catch 11 12 however, this information may be released to government 13 agencies concerned with the management of fish and wildlife 14 resources;
- (2) Sensitive fish and wildlife data. Sensitive fish and wildlife 15 data may be released to the following entities and their agents for 16 17 fish, wildlife, land management purposes, or scientific research needs: Government agencies, public utilities, and accredited colleges 18 and universities. Sensitive fish and wildlife data may be released to 19 20 tribal governments. Sensitive fish and wildlife data may also be released to the owner, lessee, or right-of-way or easement holder of 21 22 the private land to which the data pertains. The release of sensitive 23 fish and wildlife data may be subject to a confidentiality agreement, 24 except upon release of sensitive fish and wildlife data to the owner, lessee, or right-of-way or easement holder of private land who 25 initially provided the data. Sensitive fish and wildlife data does 26 27 include data related to reports of predatory wildlife specified in RCW 77.12.885. Sensitive fish and wildlife data must 28 29 meet at least one of the following criteria of this subsection as applied by the department of fish and wildlife: 30

- 1 (a) The nesting sites or specific locations of endangered species 2 designated under RCW 77.12.020, or threatened or sensitive species 3 classified by rule of the department of fish and wildlife;
 - (b) Radio frequencies used in, or locational data generated by, telemetry studies; or
 - (c) Other location data that could compromise the viability of a specific fish or wildlife population, and where at least one of the following criteria are met:
 - (i) The species has a known commercial or black market value;
- 10 (ii) There is a history of malicious take of that species and the species behavior or ecology renders it especially vulnerable;
- 12 (iii) There is a known demand to visit, take, or disturb the 13 species; or
- 14 (iv) The species has an extremely limited distribution and 15 concentration;
 - (3) The following information regarding any damage prevention cooperative agreement, or nonlethal preventative measures deployed to minimize wolf interactions with pets and livestock:
 - (a) The name, telephone number, residential address, and other personally identifying information of any person who has a current damage prevention cooperative agreement with the department, including a pet or livestock owner, and his or her employees or immediate family members, who agrees to deploy, or is responsible for the deployment of, nonlethal, preventative measures; and

- 23 **Sec. 2.** RCW 77.12.885 and 2007 c 293 s 2 are each amended to 24 read as follows:
- 25 Except for the personal information on reported depredations by wolves that is exempted from disclosure as provided in RCW 42.56.430, 26 27 the department shall post on its internet web site all reported predatory wildlife interactions, including reported human safety 28 confrontations or sightings as well as the known details of reported 29 30 depredations by predatory wildlife on humans, pets, or livestock, within ten days of receiving the report. The posted material must 31 include, but is not limited to, the location and time, the known 32 details, and a running summary of such reported interactions by 33 identified specie and interaction type within each affected county. 34 35 For the purposes of this section and RCW 42.56.430, "predatory wildlife" means grizzly bears, wolves, and cougars. 36
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 42.56

38 RCW to read as follows:

1 By December 1, 2021, the public records exemptions accountability committee, in addition to its duties in RCW 42.56.140, must prepare 2 and submit a report to the legislature that includes recommendations 3 on whether the exemptions created in section 1, chapter . . ., Laws 4 of 2017 (section 1 of this act) should be continued or allowed to 5 6 expire. The report should focus on whether the exemption continues to serve the intent of the legislature in section 1, chapter . . ., Laws 7 of 2017 (section 1 of this act) to provide protections of personal 8 information during the period the state establishes and implements 9 new policies regarding wolf management. The committee must consider 10 11 whether the development of wolf management policy, by the time of the report, has diminished risks of threats to personal safety so that 12 the protection of personal information in section 1, chapter . . ., 13 Laws of 2017 (section 1 of this act) is no longer an ongoing 14 necessity. 15

NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. This act expires June 30, 2022."

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On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "depredations;" strike the remainder of the title and insert "amending RCW 42.56.430 and 77.12.885; adding a new section to chapter 42.56 RCW; and providing an expiration date."

<u>EFFECT:</u> Clarifies the public records exemption for a location related to a depredation. Clarifies that the personally identifying information of persons with a current damage prevention cooperative agreement with the department is exempt from disclosure.

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
