- 11 (c) Liquor served at the event may be:
- (i) Provided by individuals attending the event for their own consumption or with the intent to share, at no cost, with other attendees;
- (ii) Included in the total price for an event when participants
 receive an equal share by distribution of exchangeable tickets as
 part of the package; or
- 18 <u>(iii) Purchased by the event organizers at an authorized retail</u>
 19 source.
- 20 <u>(d) The nonprofit organization may accept cash donations at an</u> 21 <u>event so long as there is no expectation or implied obligation to</u> 22 give a donation in exchange for a beverage containing liquor.
- (e) The fee for the banquet permit is ten dollars per day.
- 24 <u>(f) For events occurring under this subsection, the board must</u> 25 <u>provide for an online permit to be issued on the day the event</u> 26 <u>occurs.</u>
- 27 (g) For the purposes of this subsection (18), "nonprofit
 28 organization" means an entity incorporated as a nonprofit

On page 1, line 1 of the title, after "creating" strike all material through "auctions" on line 2 and insert "special permits for nonprofit organizations"

EFFECT: Allows nonprofit organizations to obtain a banquet permit, on the day of the event, for a fee of \$10 per day. Limits the provision to those organizations that have an annual gross income of less than \$250,000. Specifies conditions under which liquor may be served at the event.
