On page 317, after line 33 insert the following: 1 2 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 976. RCW 28B.15.067 and 2015 3rd sp.s. c 36 s 3 3 are each amended to read as follows: 4 (1) Tuition fees shall be established under the provisions of 5 6 this chapter. (2) Beginning in the 2011-12 academic year and through the 2014-7 15 academic year, reductions or increases in full-time tuition fees 8 9 shall be as provided in the omnibus appropriations act for resident 10 undergraduate students at community and technical colleges. (3)(a) In the 2015-16 and 2016-17 academic years, tuition 11 12 operating fees for resident undergraduates at community and 13 technical colleges excluding applied baccalaureate degrees as 14 defined in RCW 28B.50.030, shall be five percent less than the 2014-15 academic year tuition operating fee. 15 (b) In the 2017-18 and 2018-19 academic years, tuition operating 16 fees for resident undergraduates at community and technical colleges 17 shall remain the same as the fee set in the 2016-17 academic year. 18 (c) Beginning in the ((2017-18)) 2019-20 academic year, tuition 19 20 operating fees for resident undergraduates at community and 21 technical colleges excluding applied baccalaureate degrees as 22 defined in RCW 28B.50.030, may increase by no more than the average 23 annual percentage growth rate in the median hourly wage for 24 Washington for the previous fourteen years as the wage is determined 25 by the federal bureau of labor statistics. (4) The governing boards of the state universities, regional 26

27 universities, and The Evergreen State College; and the state board

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1 for community and technical colleges may reduce or increase full-2 time tuition fees for all students other than resident 3 undergraduates, including nonresident students, summer school 4 students, and students in other self-supporting degree programs. 5 Percentage increases in full-time tuition may exceed the fiscal 6 growth factor. Except during the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium, the 7 state board for community and technical colleges may pilot or 8 institute differential tuition models. The board may define scale, 9 scope, and rationale for the models.

10 (5)(a) Beginning with the 2011-12 academic year and through the 11 end of the 2014-15 academic year, the governing boards of the state 12 universities, the regional universities, and The Evergreen State 13 College may reduce or increase full-time tuition fees for all 14 students, including summer school students and students in other 15 self-supporting degree programs. Percentage increases in full-time 16 tuition fees may exceed the fiscal growth factor. Reductions or 17 increases may be made for all or portions of an institution's 18 programs, campuses, courses, or students; however, during the 2013-19 2015 fiscal biennium, reductions or increases in tuition must be 20 uniform among resident undergraduate students.

(b) Prior to reducing or increasing tuition for each academic (c) year, the governing boards of the state universities, the regional universities, and The Evergreen State College shall consult with existing student associations or organizations with student undergraduate and graduate representatives regarding the impacts of potential tuition increases. Each governing board shall make public rits proposal for tuition and fee increases twenty-one days before the governing board of the institution considers adoption and allow opportunity for public comment. However, the requirement to make public a proposal for tuition and fee increases twenty-one days before the governing board considers adoption shall not apply if the comnibus appropriations act has not passed the legislature by May 15th. Governing boards shall be required to provide data regarding the percentage of students receiving financial aid, the sources of

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1 aid, and the percentage of total costs of attendance paid for by 2 aid.

3 (c) Prior to reducing or increasing tuition for each academic 4 year, the state board for community and technical college system 5 shall consult with existing student associations or organizations 6 with undergraduate student representation regarding the impacts of 7 potential tuition increases. The state board for community and 8 technical colleges shall provide data regarding the percentage of 9 students receiving financial aid, the sources of aid, and the 10 percentage of total costs of attendance paid for by aid.

11 (6)(a) In the 2015-16 academic year, full-time tuition operating 12 fees for resident undergraduates for state universities, regional 13 universities, The Evergreen State College, and applied baccalaureate 14 degrees as defined in RCW 28B.50.030 shall be five percent less than 15 the 2014-15 academic year tuition operating fee.

(b) Beginning with the 2016-17 academic year, full-time tuition17 operating fees for resident undergraduates for:

18 (i) State universities shall be fifteen percent less than the19 2014-15 academic year tuition operating fee; and

(ii) Regional universities, The Evergreen State College, and applied baccalaureate degrees as defined in RCW 28B.50.030 shall be twenty percent less than the 2014-15 academic year tuition operating fee.

(c) <u>In the 2017-18 and 2018-19 academic years, full-time tuition</u>
<u>operating fees for resident undergraduates in (a) of this subsection</u>
<u>shall remain the same as the fee set in the 2016-17 academic year.</u>
<u>(d)</u> Beginning with the ((2017-18)) <u>2019-20</u> academic year, fulltime tuition operating fees for resident undergraduates in (a) of
this subsection may increase by no more than the average annual
percentage growth rate in the median hourly wage for Washington for
the previous fourteen years as the wage is determined by the federal
bureau of labor statistics.

33 (7) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not34 apply to high school students enrolling in participating

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1 institutions of higher education under RCW 28A.600.300 through
2 28A.600.400.

3 (8) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not 4 apply to eligible students enrolling in a dropout reengagement 5 program through an interlocal agreement between a school district 6 and a community or technical college under RCW 28A.175.100 through 7 28A.175.110.

8 (9) The legislative advisory committee to the committee on 9 advanced tuition payment established in RCW 28B.95.170 shall: 10 (a) Review the impact of differential tuition rates on the 11 funded status and future unit price of the Washington advanced 12 college tuition payment program; and

(b) No later than January 14, 2013, make a recommendation to the appropriate policy and fiscal committees of the legislature regarding how differential tuition should be addressed in order to maintain the ongoing solvency of the Washington advanced college to tuition payment program.

18 (10) As a result of any changes in tuition under section 3, 19 chapter 36, Laws of 2015 3rd sp. sess., the governing boards of the 20 state universities, the regional universities, and The Evergreen 21 State College shall not reduce resident undergraduate enrollment 22 below the 2014-15 academic year levels."

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Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any internal references accordingly.
