1 AN ACT Relating to providing for the coordination of continuity 2 of operations efforts for elections; amending RCW 38.52.030; and 3 creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

<u>NEW SECT</u>ION. 5 Sec. 1. The legislature finds that, in 2017, the 6 federal department of homeland security designated election 7 infrastructure as part of our nation's critical infrastructure. Elections play a vital role in our democracy, and it is important 8 9 that election administrators are able to continue election operations emergencies. Given the federal designation of election 10 during 11 infrastructure as critical infrastructure, counties should maintain a 12 continuity of operations plan for the continuity of elections and the 13 full execution of essential election operations in emergencies.

14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 38.52.030 and 2015 c 61 s 3 are each amended to read 15 as follows:

16 (1) The director may employ such personnel and may make such 17 expenditures within the appropriation therefor, or from other funds 18 made available for purposes of emergency management, as may be 19 necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter.

1 (2) The director, subject to the direction and control of the governor, shall be responsible to the governor for carrying out the 2 program for emergency management of this state. The director shall 3 coordinate the activities of all organizations for 4 emergency management within the state, and shall maintain liaison with and 5 б cooperate with emergency management agencies and organizations of other states and of the federal government, and shall have such 7 additional authority, duties, and responsibilities authorized by this 8 chapter, as may be prescribed by the governor. 9

(3) The director shall develop and maintain a comprehensive, all-10 11 hazard emergency plan for the state which shall include an analysis 12 of the natural, technological, or human caused hazards which could affect the state of Washington, and shall include the procedures to 13 14 be used during emergencies for coordinating local resources, as necessary, and the resources of all state agencies, departments, 15 16 commissions, and boards. The comprehensive emergency management plan 17 shall direct the department in times of state emergency to administer 18 and manage the state's emergency operations center. This will include 19 representation from all appropriate state agencies and be available as a single point of contact for the authorizing of state resources 20 21 or actions, including emergency permits. The comprehensive emergency management plan must specify the use of the incident command system 22 for multiagency/multijurisdiction operations. The comprehensive, all-23 hazard emergency plan authorized under this subsection may not 24 25 include preparation for emergency evacuation or relocation of 26 residents in anticipation of nuclear attack. This plan shall be known 27 as the comprehensive emergency management plan.

28 (4) In accordance with the comprehensive emergency management 29 plans and the programs for the emergency management of this state, the director shall procure supplies and equipment, institute training 30 31 programs and public information programs, and shall take all other 32 preparatory steps, including the partial or full mobilization of 33 emergency management organizations in advance of actual disaster, to insure the furnishing of adequately trained and equipped forces of 34 35 emergency management personnel in time of need.

36 (5) The director shall make such studies and surveys of the 37 industries, resources, and facilities in this state as may be 38 necessary to ascertain the capabilities of the state for emergency 39 management, and shall plan for the most efficient emergency use 40 thereof.

1 (6) The emergency management council shall advise the director on 2 all aspects of the communications and warning systems and facilities 3 operated or controlled under the provisions of this chapter.

4 (7) The director, through the state enhanced 911 coordinator,
5 shall coordinate and facilitate implementation and operation of a
6 statewide enhanced 911 emergency communications network.

7 (8) The director shall appoint a state coordinator of search and rescue operations to coordinate those state resources, services and 8 facilities (other than those for which the state director of 9 aeronautics is directly responsible) requested by political 10 11 subdivisions in support of search and rescue operations, and on 12 request to maintain liaison with and coordinate the resources, services, and facilities of political subdivisions when more than one 13 14 political subdivision is engaged in joint search and rescue 15 operations.

16 (9) The director, subject to the direction and control of the 17 governor, shall prepare and administer a state program for emergency 18 assistance to individuals within the state who are victims of a natural, technological, or human caused disaster, as defined by RCW 19 20 38.52.010(((+5))) (6). Such program may be integrated into and 21 coordinated with disaster assistance plans and programs of the federal government which provide to the state, or through the state 22 to any political subdivision thereof, services, equipment, supplies, 23 materials, or funds by way of gift, grant, or loan for purposes of 24 25 assistance to individuals affected by a disaster. Further, such 26 program may include, but shall not be limited to, grants, loans, or 27 gifts of services, equipment, supplies, materials, or funds of the state, or any political subdivision thereof, to individuals who, as a 28 result of a disaster, are in need of assistance and who meet 29 standards of eligibility for disaster assistance established by the 30 31 department of social and health services: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That nothing herein shall be construed in any manner inconsistent with the 32 provisions of Article VIII, section 5 or section 7 of the Washington 33 state Constitution. 34

(10) The director shall appoint a state coordinator for radioactive and hazardous waste emergency response programs. The coordinator shall consult with the state radiation control officer in matters relating to radioactive materials. The duties of the state coordinator for radioactive and hazardous waste emergency response programs shall include:

(a) Assessing the current needs and capabilities of state and
 local radioactive and hazardous waste emergency response teams on an
 ongoing basis;

4 (b) Coordinating training programs for state and local officials
5 for the purpose of updating skills relating to emergency mitigation,
6 preparedness, response, and recovery;

7 (c) Utilizing appropriate training programs such as those offered
8 by the federal emergency management agency, the department of
9 transportation and the environmental protection agency; and

10 (d) Undertaking other duties in this area that are deemed 11 appropriate by the director.

(11) The director is responsible to the governor to lead the development and management of a program for interagency coordination and prioritization of continuity of operations planning by state agencies. Each state agency is responsible for developing an organizational continuity of operations plan that is updated and exercised annually in compliance with the program for interagency coordination of continuity of operations planning.

19 (12) The director shall maintain a copy of the continuity of 20 operations plan for election operations for each county that has a 21 plan available.

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
