1 BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2 STATE OF WASHINGTON, IN LEGISLATIVE SESSION ASSEMBLED:

3 THAT, At the next general election to be held in this state the 4 secretary of state shall submit to the qualified voters of the state 5 for their approval and ratification, or rejection, an amendment to 6 Article VII, section 1 of the Constitution of the state of Washington 7 to read as follows:

8 Article VII, section 1. The power of taxation shall never be 9 suspended, surrendered or contracted away. All taxes shall be uniform upon the same class of property within the territorial limits of the 10 11 authority levying the tax and shall be levied and collected for 12 public purposes only. The word "property" as used herein shall mean 13 and include everything, whether tangible or intangible, subject to 14 ownership. All real estate shall constitute one class: Provided, That 15 the legislature may tax mines and mineral resources and lands devoted to reforestation by either a yield tax or an ad valorem tax at such 16 17 rate as it may fix, or by both. Such property as the legislature may by general laws provide shall be exempt from taxation. Property of 18 the United States and of the state, counties, school districts and 19 other municipal corporations, and credits secured by property 20 actually taxed in this state, not exceeding in value the value of 21 22 such property, shall be exempt from taxation. The legislature shall

have power, by appropriate legislation, to exempt personal property 1 to the amount of fifteen thousand (\$15,000.00) dollars for each head 2 of a family liable to assessment and taxation under the provisions of 3 the laws of this state of which the individual is the actual bona 4 fide owner. The legislature shall have the power, by appropriate 5 б legislation, to provide a homestead exemption from the property taxes 7 levied for state purposes of up to fifty thousand (\$50,000.00) dollars of valuation of residential real property. The legislature 8 may place such restrictions and conditions upon the granting of the 9 homestead exemption as it deems proper. 10

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the secretary of state shall cause notice of this constitutional amendment to be published at least four times during the four weeks next preceding the election in every legal newspaper in the state.

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
