- 7 16 s 1, and 2016 c 15 s 1 are each reenacted and amended to read as

- 11 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized
- 12 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license
- 13 plates unless otherwise specified;

- 16 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter
- 17 46.87 RCW; and
- 18 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

- (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington state council of firefighters.
- (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b) have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting service before ten years of service have been completed, the volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the

1 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer 2 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves, the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter 3 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will 4 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying 5 б volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates 7 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a 8 9 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be surrendered upon conviction. 10

- **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2016 c 36 s 2, 2016 c 31 s 2, 2016 c 30 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 2, and 2016 c 15 s 2 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special license plate fee as listed in this section.

- 6 (2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for 7 the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the 8 principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to 9 10 construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including 11 reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being 12 collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer 13 shall credit the funds to the state general fund.
- 14 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2016 c 36 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 3, and 2016 c 15 s 3 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
  - (1) The department shall:

- 17 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW 18 46.17.220;
- 19 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial 20 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and 21 collection expenses incurred by it; and
- (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.
  - (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the following appropriate account as created in this section in the custody of the state treasurer:

- (3) Only the director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.
- (4) Funds in the special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.
- 18 (5) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in 20 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status 21 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization 22 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW to read as follows:
- "Imagine license plates" means special license plates issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display the John Lennon self-portrait image and the slogan "Imagine," to support Feeding Washington for programs to end hunger in Washington.
- 29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** This act takes effect January 1, 2018.
