1 AN ACT Relating to creating a task force on addressing talent
2 pipeline gaps in the outdoor recreation industry; creating a new
3 section; and providing an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The institutions of higher education,
6 the council of presidents, the state board for community and
7 technical colleges, and the Washington student achievement council
8 shall collaborate to carry out the following goals:

9 (a) Identify talent pipeline gaps within the outdoor recreation
10 industry in the state; and

11 (b) Develop recommendations for institutions of higher education
12 to create master's, bachelor's, and associate degrees and certificate
13 programs that meet the needs of the outdoor recreation industry.

14 (2) The task force on talent pipeline gaps in the outdoor
15 recreation industry is established.

16 (a) The task force includes the following members:

17 (i) One representative from the state board for community and
18 technical colleges;

19 (ii) One representative from each of the state universities, the
20 regional universities, and the state college, who has expertise in
21 curriculum development;

1 (iii) One representative from the council of presidents;
2 (iv) One representative from the student achievement council; and
3 (v) Four public representatives, each of whom has expertise in a
4 different sector of the outdoor recreation industry within the state.
5 (b) The task force shall select two cochairs to facilitate its
6 progress. One cochair shall represent the group in (a)(i) of this
7 subsection and the other cochair shall be the representative
8 described in (a)(ii) of this subsection.
9 (c) The purpose of the task force is to coordinate and implement
10 the goals in subsection (1) of this section.
11 (3) The task force shall report to the legislature and the
12 institutions of higher education on its goals and recommendations by
13 December 17, 2018.
14 (4) Staff support for the task force shall be jointly provided by
15 the council of presidents and the state board for community and
16 technical colleges.
17 (5) For the purposes of this section, "institutions of higher
18 education" has the same meaning as in RCW 28B.10.016.
19 (6) To select the representatives from the outdoor recreation
20 industry under subsection (2)(a)(v) of this section, the student
21 achievement council shall issue a request for interest, asking who
22 wishes to participate on the task force as a volunteer. The names and
23 resumes, including experience participating in similar efforts, of
24 proposed task force members must be submitted to the student
25 achievement council. The student achievement council shall give this
26 information to the task force and the task force chairs shall select
27 the four representatives from this pool of candidates.
28 (7) This section expires December 31, 2018.

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
