AN ACT Relating to increasing commercial fishing license fees for nonresidents; amending RCW 77.65.150, 77.65.160, 77.65.170, 77.65.190, 77.65.200, 77.65.210, 77.65.220, 77.65.280, 77.65.340, 77.65.390, 77.65.440, 77.65.480, 77.65.510, and 77.12.453; and providing an effective date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 Sec. 1. RCW 77.65.150 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 21 are each 8 amended to read as follows:

8 (2) A salmon charter license designating a vessel is required to 9 operate a charter boat from which persons may, for a fee, fish for 10 salmon, other fish, and shellfish. The director may issue a salmon 11 charter license only to a person who meets the qualifications of RCW 12 77.70.050.

13 (3) A nonsalmon charter license designating a vessel is required 14 to operate a charter boat from which persons may, for a fee, fish for 15 shellfish and fish other than salmon or albacore tuna.

(4)(a) "Charter boat" means a vessel from which persons may, for a fee, fish for food fish or shellfish for personal use in those state waters set forth in (b) of this subsection. "Charter boat" also means a vessel from which persons may, for a fee, fish for fish or shellfish for personal use in offshore waters or in the waters of other states. The director may specify by rule when a vessel is a "charter boat" within this definition.

(b) A person may not operate a vessel from which persons may, for
a fee, fish for food fish or shellfish in Puget Sound, Grays Harbor,
Willapa Bay, Pacific Ocean waters, Lake Washington, or the Columbia
river below the bridge at Longview unless the vessel is designated on
a charter boat license.

28 (5) A charter boat licensed in Oregon may fish without а Washington charter license under the same rules as Washington charter 29 30 boat operators in ocean waters within the jurisdiction of Washington state from the southern border of the state of Washington to 31 Leadbetter Point, as long as the Oregon vessel does not take on or 32 33 discharge passengers for any purpose from any Washington port, the Washington shore, or a dock, landing, or other point in Washington. 34 35 The provisions of this subsection shall be in effect as long as the state of Oregon has reciprocal laws and regulations. 36

37 (6) A salmon charter license under subsection (1)(b) of this
 38 section may be renewed if the license holder notifies the department
 39 by May 1st of that year that he or she will not participate in the

fishery during that calendar year. The license holder must pay the one hundred dollar enhancement surcharge, a thirty-five dollar surcharge to be deposited in the rockfish research account created in RCW 77.12.702, plus a one hundred five dollar application fee, in order to be considered a valid renewal and eligible to renew the license the following year.

7 Sec. 2. RCW 77.65.160 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 22 are each 8 amended to read as follows:

9 (1) The following commercial salmon fishery licenses are required 10 for the license holder to use the specified gear to fish for salmon 11 in state waters. Only a person who meets the qualifications of RCW 12 77.70.090 may hold a license listed in this subsection. The licenses 13 and their annual license fees, application fees, and surcharges under 14 RCW 77.95.090 are:

(2) A license issued under this section authorizes no taking or
 delivery of salmon or other food fish unless a vessel is designated
 under RCW 77.65.100.

1 (3) Holders of commercial salmon fishery licenses may retain 2 incidentally caught food fish other than salmon, subject to rules of 3 the department.

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(4) A salmon troll license includes a salmon delivery license.

5 (5) A salmon gill net license authorizes the taking of salmon 6 only in the geographical area for which the license is issued. The 7 geographical designations in subsection (1) of this section have the 8 following meanings:

(a) "Puget Sound" includes waters of the Strait of Juan de Fuca, 9 Georgia Strait, Puget Sound and all bays, inlets, canals, coves, 10 11 sounds, and estuaries lying easterly and southerly of the 12 international boundary line and a line at the entrance to the Strait of Juan de Fuca projected northerly from Cape Flattery to the 13 lighthouse on Tatoosh Island and then to Bonilla Point on Vancouver 14 Island. 15

16 (b) "Grays Harbor-Columbia river" includes waters of Grays Harbor 17 and tributary estuaries lying easterly of a line projected northerly 18 from Point Chehalis Light to Point Brown and those waters of the 19 Columbia river and tributary sloughs and estuaries easterly of a line 20 at the entrance to the Columbia river projected southerly from the 21 most westerly point of the North jetty to the most westerly point of 22 the South jetty.

(c) "Willapa Bay-Columbia river" includes waters of Willapa Bay and tributary estuaries and easterly of a line projected northerly from Leadbetter Point to the Cape Shoalwater tower and those waters of the Columbia river and tributary sloughs described in (b) of this subsection.

28 (6) A commercial salmon troll fishery license may be renewed under this section if the license holder notifies the department by 29 May 1st of that year that he or she will not participate in the 30 31 fishery during that calendar year. A commercial salmon gill net, reef 32 net, or seine fishery license may be renewed under this section if the license holder notifies the department before the third Monday in 33 September of that year that he or she will not participate in the 34 fishery during that calendar year. The license holder must pay the 35 one hundred dollar enhancement surcharge, plus a one hundred five 36 dollar application fee before the third Monday in September, in order 37 to be considered a valid renewal and eligible to renew the license 38 39 the following year.

1 (7) Notwithstanding the annual license fees and surcharges 2 established in subsection (1) of this section, a person who holds a 3 resident commercial salmon fishery license shall pay an annual 4 license fee of one hundred dollars plus the surcharge and application 5 fee if all of the following conditions are met:

(a) The license holder is at least seventy-five years of age;

7 (b) The license holder owns a fishing vessel and has fished with 8 a resident commercial salmon fishery license for at least thirty 9 years; and

10 (c) The commercial salmon fishery license is for a geographical 11 area other than the Puget Sound.

12 An alternate operator may not be designated for a license renewed 13 at the one hundred dollar annual fee under this subsection (7).

14 **Sec. 3.** RCW 77.65.170 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 23 are each 15 amended to read as follows:

16 (1) A salmon delivery license is required for a commercial fishing vessel to deliver salmon taken for commercial purposes in 17 offshore waters to a place or port in the state. As used in this 18 section, "deliver" and "delivery" mean arrival at a place or port, 19 20 and include arrivals from offshore waters to waters within the state and arrivals ashore from offshore waters. The annual fee for a salmon 21 delivery license is four hundred thirty dollars for residents and 22 ((five hundred five)) eight hundred fifteen dollars for nonresidents. 23 24 The application fee for a salmon delivery license is one hundred five 25 dollars. The annual surcharge under RCW 77.95.090 is one hundred dollars for each license. Holders of nonlimited entry delivery 26 27 licenses issued under RCW 77.65.210 may apply the nonlimited entry delivery license fee against the salmon delivery license fee. 28

(2) Only a person who meets the qualifications established in RCW
 77.70.090 may hold a salmon delivery license issued under this
 section.

32 (3) A salmon delivery license authorizes no taking of salmon or33 other fish or shellfish from the waters of the state.

(4) If the director determines that the operation of a vessel under a salmon delivery license results in the depletion or destruction of the state's salmon resource or the delivery into this state of salmon products prohibited by law, the director may revoke the license under the procedures of chapter 34.05 RCW.

1 Sec. 4. RCW 77.65.190 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 24 are each 2 amended to read as follows:

A person who does not qualify for a license under RCW 77.70.090 3 shall obtain a nontransferable emergency salmon delivery license to 4 make one delivery from a commercial fishing vessel of salmon taken 5 б for commercial purposes in offshore waters. As used in this section, "delivery" means arrival at a place or port, and include arrivals 7 from offshore waters to waters within the state and arrivals ashore 8 from offshore waters. The director shall not issue an emergency 9 salmon delivery license unless, as determined by the director, a bona 10 11 fide emergency exists. The license fee is two hundred seventy-five 12 dollars for residents and ((three hundred fifty)) six hundred sixty dollars for nonresidents. The application fee is one hundred five 13 14 dollars. An applicant for an emergency salmon delivery license shall designate no more than one vessel that will be used with the license. 15 16 Alternate operator licenses are not required of persons delivering 17 salmon under an emergency salmon delivery license. Emergency salmon 18 delivery licenses are not renewable.

19 **Sec. 5.** RCW 77.65.200 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 25 are each 20 amended to read as follows:

(1) This section establishes commercial fishery licenses required for food fish fisheries and the annual fees for those licenses. As used in this section, "food fish" does not include salmon. The director may issue a limited-entry commercial fishery license only to a person who meets the qualifications established in applicable governing sections of this title.

(2) The director may by rule determine the species of food fish 25 that may be taken with the commercial fishery licenses established in 26 27 this section, the gear that may be used with the licenses, and the areas or waters in which the licenses may be used. Where a fishery 28 29 license has been established for a particular species, gear, 30 geographical area, or combination thereof, a more general fishery 31 license may not be used to take food fish in that fishery.

32 **Sec. 6.** RCW 77.65.210 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 26 are each 33 amended to read as follows:

(1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, a
 person may not use a commercial fishing vessel to deliver food fish
 or shellfish taken for commercial purposes in offshore waters to a

1 port in the state without a nonlimited entry delivery license. As used in this section, "deliver" and "delivery" mean arrival at a 2 place or port, and include arrivals from offshore waters to waters 3 within the state and arrivals ashore from offshore waters. As used in 4 this section, "food fish" does not include salmon. As used in this 5 6 section, "shellfish" does not include ocean pink shrimp, coastal crab, coastal spot shrimp, or fish or shellfish taken under an 7 emerging commercial fisheries license if taken from offshore waters. 8 The annual license fee for a nonlimited entry delivery license is two 9 hundred sixty dollars for residents and ((three hundred thirty-five)) 10 11 six hundred forty-five dollars for nonresidents, and an additional 12 thirty-five dollar surcharge for both residents and nonresidents to be deposited in the rockfish research account created in RCW 13 77.12.702. The application fee for a nonlimited entry delivery 14 license is one hundred five dollars. 15

(2) Holders of the following licenses may deliver food fish or 16 17 shellfish taken in offshore waters without a nonlimited entry delivery license: Salmon troll fishery licenses issued under RCW 18 19 77.65.160; salmon delivery licenses issued under RCW 77.65.170; crab pot fishery licenses issued under RCW 77.65.220; food fish trawl-Non-20 21 Puget Sound fishery licenses, and emerging commercial fishery licenses issued under RCW 77.65.200; Dungeness crab—coastal fishery 22 23 licenses; ocean pink shrimp delivery licenses; Washington coastal spot shrimp pot fishery licenses issued under chapter 77.70 RCW; and 24 25 emerging commercial fishery licenses issued under RCW 77.65.220.

26 (3) A nonlimited entry delivery license authorizes no taking of27 fish or shellfish from state waters.

28 **Sec. 7.** RCW 77.65.220 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 27 are each 29 amended to read as follows:

30 (1) This section establishes commercial fishery licenses required 31 for shellfish fisheries and the annual fees for those licenses. The 32 director may issue a limited-entry commercial fishery license only to 33 a person who meets the qualifications established in applicable 34 governing sections of this title.

 36 this section, the gear that may be used with the licenses, and the

1 areas or waters in which the licenses may be used. Where a fishery 2 license has been established for a particular species, gear, 3 geographical area, or combination thereof, a more general fishery 4 license may not be used to take shellfish in that fishery.

5 Sec. 8. RCW 77.65.280 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 29 are each 6 amended to read as follows:

7 (1) A fish dealer license is required for a person in the state 8 who:

9 (a) Takes possession of raw or frozen fish or shellfish, in whole 10 or in parts, to prepare, repackage, process, or preserve. This 11 includes, but is not limited to:

(i) Canning or processing of fish or shellfish for payment, whether the fish or shellfish is commercially harvested or taken for personal use; and

(ii) The commercial manufacture or preparation of fertilizer, oil, meal, caviar, fish bait, or any other by-products from fish or shellfish;

(b) Engages in the wholesale selling, buying, or brokering of raw or frozen fish or shellfish. Certain buyers may be additionally required to obtain a wholesale fish buyer endorsement as specified in RCW 77.65.340.

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(2) A fish dealer license is not required for:

(a) Licensed commercial fish or shellfish harvesters who either
 sell only to licensed wholesale fish buyers or who possess a limited
 fish seller endorsement;

(b) Retail businesses that purchase exclusively from Washington
 licensed wholesale fish buyers or from limited fish sellers for sale
 to end consumers.

(3) A business engaged in any activity requiring a fish dealer
 license only needs to purchase one fish dealer license to cover the
 actions of all employees.

32 (4) The annual license fee for a resident fish dealer is four 33 hundred dollars. The fee for a nonresident fish dealer license is 34 ((four hundred seventy-five)) seven hundred eighty-five dollars. The 35 application fee for both resident and nonresident licenses is one 36 hundred five dollars.

37 **Sec. 9.** RCW 77.65.340 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 33 are each 38 amended to read as follows: (1) A wholesale fish buyer endorsement is required for a licensed
 fish dealer:

3 (a) To take first possession or ownership of fish or shellfish
4 directly from a commercial fisher that is landed into the state of
5 Washington;

6 (b) To take first possession or ownership of raw or frozen fish 7 or shellfish in the state of Washington from interstate or foreign 8 commerce; or

9 (c) To engage in the wholesale buying or selling of fish or 10 shellfish harvested by Indian fishers lawfully exercising fishing 11 rights reserved by federal statute, treaty, or executive order, and 12 the dealer is also responsible for documenting the commercial harvest 13 and sales according to the rules of the department.

14 (2) A business licensed as a fish dealer must purchase at least 15 one wholesale fish buyer endorsement to engage in the activities in 16 subsection (1) of this section, which allows the business to buy or 17 sell on its premises and which allows one named employee to buy and 18 sell off premises. A business must obtain an additional wholesale 19 fish buyer endorsement for each additional employee who buys and 20 sells fish or shellfish off premises.

21 (3) The annual fee for a resident wholesale fish buyer's endorsement for business operations with only one fish buyer is fifty 22 dollars. The annual fee for a resident wholesale fish buyer's 23 endorsement for business operations with two or more employees is two 24 25 hundred forty-five dollars. The annual fee for a nonresident 26 wholesale fish buyer's endorsement is ((three hundred twenty)) six hundred thirty dollars. The application fee for both resident and 27 28 nonresident endorsements is one hundred five dollars.

29 Sec. 10. RCW 77.65.390 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 36 are each 30 amended to read as follows:

An ocean pink shrimp delivery license is required 31 for а commercial fishing vessel to deliver ocean pink shrimp taken for 32 commercial purposes in offshore waters and delivered to a port in the 33 state. As used in this section, "deliver" and "delivery" mean arrival 34 35 at a place or port, and include arrivals from offshore waters to waters within the state and arrivals from state or offshore waters. 36 The annual license fee is three hundred dollars for residents and 37 ((three hundred seventy-five)) six hundred eighty-five dollars for 38

nonresidents. The application fee is one hundred five dollars. Ocean
 pink shrimp delivery licenses are transferable.

18 Sec. 12. RCW 77.65.480 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 38 are each 19 amended to read as follows:

(1) A taxidermy license allows the holder to practice taxidermy
for commercial purposes, as that term is defined in RCW 77.15.110.
The fee for this license is one hundred eighty dollars. The
application fee is seventy dollars.

(2) A fur dealer's license allows the holder to purchase,
receive, or resell raw furs for commercial purposes, as that term is
defined in RCW 77.15.110. The fee for this license is one hundred
eighty dollars. The application fee is seventy dollars.

(3)(a) A game fish guide license allows the holder to offer or perform the services of a game fish guide in the taking of game fish. The fee for this license is ((four hundred ten)) three hundred five dollars for a resident and ((four hundred eighty-five)) six hundred <u>ninety</u> dollars for a nonresident. The application fee is seventy dollars. An application for a game fish guide license must include the information required in RCW 77.65.560.

(b) A game fish guide license purchased by a person, firm, or
 business on behalf of an employee is subject to RCW 77.65.600.

1 (4) A game farm license allows the holder to operate a game farm 2 to acquire, breed, grow, keep, and sell wildlife under conditions 3 prescribed by the rules adopted pursuant to this title. The fee for 4 this license is seventy-two dollars for the first year and forty-5 eight dollars for each following year. The application fee is seventy 6 dollars.

7 (5) A game fish stocking permit allows the holder to release game 8 fish into the waters of the state as prescribed by rule of the 9 commission. The fee for this permit is twenty-four dollars. The 10 application fee is seventy dollars.

(6) A fishing or field trial permit allows the holder to promote, conduct, hold, or sponsor a fishing or field trial contest in accordance with rules of the commission. The fee for a fishing contest permit is twenty-four dollars. The fee for a field trial contest permit is twenty-four dollars. The application fee is seventy dollars.

17 Sec. 13. RCW 77.65.510 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 8 s 41 are each 18 amended to read as follows:

(1) The limited fish seller endorsement permits a license holder or alternate operator to clean, dress, and sell his or her commercially harvested catch directly to consumers at retail. The limited ((fish)) <u>fish</u> seller endorsement may be issued as an optional addition to all holders of a commercial fishing license issued by the department and may be purchased at the time of the underlying license sale or any time thereafter.

(2) The holder of a limited fish seller endorsement selling their 26 27 own catch directly to consumers is exempt from the permitting requirements of chapter 246-215 WAC. To ensure food safety for 28 consumers, the holder of a limited fish seller endorsement must 29 follow these requirements: (a) Only sell fresh, whole fish or fresh 30 fish that has been cleaned and dressed; (b) use ice from a commercial 31 source to hold the fish; and (c) provide the buyer with a receipt 32 stating the date of purchase, Washington fish-receiving ticket number 33 documenting the original delivery, name, address, and phone number of 34 the holder of the limited fish seller endorsement from whom the fish 35 or shellfish was purchased, and the species and weight or number of 36 fish or 37 shellfish sold. Failure to satisfy these food safety requirements is punishable as an infraction under RCW 77.15.160. A 38 licensed commercial fisher holding a limited fish seller endorsement 39

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1 may allow a designated alternate to sell under the authority of that 2 endorsement.

(3) An individual need only add one limited fish seller 3 endorsement to his or her license portfolio. If a limited fish seller 4 endorsement is selected by an individual holding more than one 5 6 commercial fishing license issued by the department, an endorsement 7 is considered to be added to all commercial fishing licenses held by that individual, and is the only endorsement required for the 8 individual to sell at retail any species permitted by any of the 9 underlying endorsed licenses. 10

(4) The fee for a resident limited fish seller endorsement is seventy dollars. The fee for a nonresident limited fish seller endorsement is ((one hundred forty-five)) four hundred fifty-five dollars. The application fee for both a resident and nonresident endorsement is one hundred five dollars.

16 (5) The holder of a limited fish seller endorsement is 17 responsible for documenting the commercial harvest and sales 18 according to the rules of the department.

(6) The limited fish seller endorsement is to be held by a 19 natural person and is not transferable or assignable. If the endorsed 20 21 license is transferred, the limited fish seller endorsement immediately becomes void, and the transferor is not eligible for a 22 full or prorated reimbursement of the annual fee paid for the limited 23 fish seller endorsement. Upon becoming void, the holder of a limited 24 25 fish seller endorsement must surrender the physical endorsement to 26 the department.

(7) The holder of a qualifying commercial fishing license or an alternate operator designated on such a license, must either possess a limited fish seller endorsement or a wholesale fish buyer endorsement provided for in RCW 77.65.340 in order to lawfully sell their catch or harvest in the state to anyone other than a licensed wholesale fish buyer.

33 **Sec. 14.** RCW 77.12.453 and 1983 1st ex.s. c 46 s 27 are each 34 amended to read as follows:

The director may issue permits to members of the Wanapum band of Indians to take salmon <u>and other freshwater food fish</u> for ceremonial and subsistence purposes. The department shall establish the areas in which the permits are valid and shall regulate the times for and

manner of taking the salmon <u>and other freshwater food fish</u>. This
 section does not create a right to fish commercially.
