- 1 WHEREAS, One hundred years ago a small nation of one million 2 people achieved freedom in the aftermath of World War I, establishing
- 3 the Republic of Estonia; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Estonia's founders stepped forward on February 24, 1918, 5 to assert their country's independence and commitment to a government
- based on justice, democracy, and the rights of the individual; and 6
- 7 This newly established Republic fought
- 8 Independence for the next two years against the forces of the Soviet
- Union; and 9
- 10 WHEREAS, Twenty-two years later Soviet tyranny again imposed
- itself on Estonia and denied the Estonian people their just right of 11
- 12 national self-determination; and
- 13 WHEREAS, In the intervening years, the United States refused to
- recognize the forcible incorporation of Estonia into the Soviet 14
- Union; and 15
- WHEREAS, Tens of thousands of Estonians fled their homeland and 16
- the resulting communist regime and immigrated to Washington where 17
- 18 they have been for decades and contribute to the rich history and
- 19 culture of our state; and
- 20 WHEREAS, An enduring belief in freedom for all people unites
- 21 Americans everywhere in celebrating this centennial anniversary; and
