1 AN ACT Relating to creating Fred Hutch special license plates;
2 reenacting and amending RCW 46.18.200, 46.17.220, and 46.68.420;
3 adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW; and providing an effective
4 date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2016 c 36 s 1, 2016 c 30 s 1, 2016 c
7 16 s 1, and 2016 c 15 s 1 are each reenacted and amended to read as
8 follows:

9 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the
10 department:

11 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized
12 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license
13 plates unless otherwise specified;

14 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the
15 department;

16 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter
17 46.87 RCW; and

18 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

19 (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special
20 license plates:

23 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
24 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
25 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
26 state council of firefighters.

27 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
28 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
29 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)
30 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate
31 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting
32 service before ten years of service have been completed, the
33 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the
34 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer
35 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,
36 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter
37 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will
38 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying

1 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates
 2 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their
 3 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a
 4 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be
 5 surrendered upon conviction.

6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2016 c 36 s 2, 2016 c 31 s 2, 2016 c
 7 30 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 2, and 2016 c 15 s 2 are each reenacted and
 8 amended to read as follows:

9 (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon
 10 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the
 11 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special
 12 license plate fee as listed in this section.

(2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds to the state general fund.

Sec. 3. RCW 46.68.420 and 2016 c 36 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 3, and 2016 c 15 s 3 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

(1) The department shall:

(a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW 46.17.220;

(b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and collection expenses incurred by it; and

(c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

(2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the following appropriate account as created in this section in the custody of the state treasurer:

10 must first be made available to the

14 exceed five years after January 1,
15 2017. After the five-year time
16 period, the funds for construction
17 must be made available to the
18 next most populous eligible city.
19 Funds for the maintenance of a
20 public tennis facility with at least
21 four indoor tennis courts must
22 first be made available to the first
23 eligible city that utilizes funds for
24 construction provided by chapter
25 16, Laws of 2016.

7 (3) Only the director or the director's designee may authorize
 8 expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this
 9 section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under
 10 chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for
 11 expenditures.

12 (4) Funds in the special license plate accounts described in
 13 subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the
 14 conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under
 15 contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations
 16 that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this
 17 section.

18 (5) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit
 19 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in
 20 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status
 21 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization
 22 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04
 24 RCW to read as follows:

25 "Fred Hutch license plates" means special license plates issued
 26 under RCW 46.18.200 that display the logo of the Fred Hutchinson
 27 cancer research center.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** This act takes effect October 1, 2017.
