1 AN ACT Relating to requiring confidentiality in the release of 2 sensitive fish and wildlife data; amending RCW 42.56.430; reenacting 3 and amending RCW 42.56.430; providing an effective date; and 4 providing an expiration date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 42.56.430 and 2017 c 246 s 1 and 2017 c 71 s 1 are 7 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

8 The following information relating to fish and wildlife is exempt 9 from disclosure under this chapter:

(1) Commercial fishing catch data from logbooks required to be 10 11 provided to the department of fish and wildlife under RCW 77.12.047, identifies specific catch 12 when the data location, timing, or 13 methodology and the release of which would result in unfair 14 competitive disadvantage to the commercial fisher providing the catch information may be released to government 15 data, however, this 16 agencies concerned with the management of fish and wildlife 17 resources;

18 (2) Sensitive fish and wildlife data. Sensitive fish and wildlife 19 data may be released to the following entities and their agents for 20 fish, wildlife, land management purposes, or scientific research 21 needs: Government agencies, public utilities, and accredited colleges

1 and universities. Sensitive fish and wildlife data may be released to tribal governments. Sensitive fish and wildlife data may also be 2 released to the owner, lessee, or right-of-way or easement holder of 3 the private land to which the data pertains. The release of sensitive 4 fish and wildlife data ((may)) must be subject to a confidentiality 5 б agreement, except upon release of sensitive fish and wildlife data to 7 the owner, lessee, or right-of-way or easement holder of private land who initially provided the data. Sensitive fish and wildlife data 8 does not include data related to reports of predatory wildlife as 9 specified in RCW 77.12.885. Sensitive fish and wildlife data must 10 meet at least one of the following criteria of this subsection as 11 12 applied by the department of fish and wildlife:

(a) The nesting sites or specific locations of endangered species
designated under RCW 77.12.020, or threatened or sensitive species
classified by rule of the department of fish and wildlife;

(a) The name, telephone number, residential address, and other personally identifying information of any person who has a current damage prevention cooperative agreement with the department, including a pet or livestock owner, and his or her employees or immediate family members, who agrees to deploy, or is responsible for the deployment of, nonlethal, preventative measures; and

(b) The legal description or name of any residential property, ranch, or farm, that is owned, leased, or used by any person included in (a) of this subsection; (4) The following information regarding a reported depredation by
 wolves on pets or livestock:

(a) Government agencies concerned with the management of fish andwildlife resources;

(b) The department of social and health services, child support division, and to the department of licensing in order to implement RCW 77.32.014 and 46.20.291; and
