- 6 (1) An operator shall file a fee schedule with the department.
 7 All filed fees must be adequate to cover the costs of service
 8 provided. No fees may exceed those filed with the department. At
 9 least ten days before the effective date of any change in an
 10 operator's fee schedule, the registered tow truck operator shall file
- 12 (2) Towing contracts with private property owners shall be in 13 written form and state the hours of authorization to impound, the 14 persons empowered to authorize the impounds, and the present charge 15 of a private impound for the classes of tow trucks to be used in the 16 impound, and must be retained in the files of the registered tow
- 17 truck operator for three years.

- 18 (3) A fee that is charged for tow truck service must be 19 calculated on an hourly basis, and after the first hour must be
- 20 charged to the nearest quarter hour.

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- 1 (4) Fees that are charged for the storage of a vehicle, or for other items of personal property registered or titled with the 2 department, must be calculated on a twenty-four hour basis and must 3 be charged to the nearest half day from the time when the ((vehicle 4 arrived)) operator has unloaded the vehicle and completed the 5 6 necessary paperwork at the secure storage area. The total amount of time to unload the towed vehicle, complete required paperwork, and 7 reasonably prepare the tow truck to return to service may be charged 8 as part of the tow truck service in fifteen-minute increments not to 9 exceed a total of sixty minutes after the return of the tow truck to 10 the secure storage area. If a portion of any fifteen-minute increment 11 exceeds a total of eight minutes, the total minutes must be rounded 12 up to the next highest fifteen-minute period of total time except in 13 the last fifteen minutes of the total sixty minutes. However, items 14 of personal property registered or titled with the department that 15 16 are wholly contained within an impounded vehicle are not subject to 17 additional storage fees; they are, however, subject to satisfying the underlying lien for towing and storage of the vehicle in which they 18 19 are contained.
