- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The department of children, youth, and families, in consultation with the department of early learning, the
- 7 office of the superintendent of public instruction, the office of
- 8 financial management, the caseload forecast council, legislative
- 9 fiscal staff, and with advice and assistance from the applicable
- 10 committees of the state interagency coordinating council, must
- 11 develop a funding model with which to determine the amount of annual
- 12 allocations that shall be appropriated in the omnibus appropriations
- 13 act after July 1, 2019, for early intervention services for children
- 14 with disabilities from birth through two years of age, which the
- 15 department of children, youth, and families oversees.
- 16 (2) The department must submit a final report that includes the
- 17 agreed-upon funding model and any necessary statutory changes to the
- 18 office of financial management and the fiscal committees of the
- 19 legislature no later than September 1, 2018.
- 20 (3) This section expires July 1, 2020.
