1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 2 following:

"<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the health and 3 safety of the traveling public, law enforcement, and emergency 4 medical service providers are enhanced by the voluntary sharing of 5 information about medical conditions, including deafness and 6 7 developmental disabilities. Licensed drivers and applicants who wish to voluntarily include a medical alert designation on their driver's 8 9 license can provide law enforcement and emergency medical service providers with the opportunity to know at the point of contact or 10 shortly thereafter that there is a medical condition which could 11 12 affect communication or account for a driver health emergency. By 13 taking action in accordance with existing driver privacy protections, 14 the legislature seeks to enhance health and public safety by the 15 voluntary provision and careful use of this information.

16 Sec. 2. RCW 46.20.117 and 2018 c 157 s 2 are each amended to 17 read as follows:

18 (1) Issuance. The department shall issue an identicard,19 containing a picture, if the applicant:

(a) Does not hold a valid Washington driver's license;

21 (b) Proves his or her identity as required by RCW 46.20.035; and

(c) Pays the required fee. Except as provided in subsection ((-(5))) (7) of this section, the fee is fifty-four dollars, unless an applicant is:

(i) A recipient of continuing public assistance grants under Title 74 RCW, who is referred in writing by the secretary of social and health services;

(ii) Under the age of eighteen and does not have a permanent residence address as determined by the department by rule; or

30 (iii) An individual who is scheduled to be released from an 31 institution as defined in RCW 13.40.020, a community facility as

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defined in RCW 72.05.020, or other juvenile rehabilitation facility operated by the department of social and health services or the department of children, youth, and families; or an individual who has been released from such an institution or facility within thirty calendar days before the date of the application.

For those persons under (c) (i) through (iii) of this subsection,
the fee must be the actual cost of production of the identicard.

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(2) (a) **Design and term**. The identicard must:

9 (i) Be distinctly designed so that it will not be confused with 10 the official driver's license; and

(ii) Except as provided in subsection (((5))) (7) of this section, expire on the sixth anniversary of the applicant's birthdate after issuance.

14 (b) The identicard may include the person's status as a veteran, 15 consistent with RCW $46.20.161((\frac{2}{2}))$ (4).

16 (c) If applicable, the identicard may include a medical alert 17 designation as provided in subsection (5) of this section.

18 (3) **Renewal.** An application for identicard renewal may be 19 submitted by means of:

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(a) Personal appearance before the department; or

21 (b) Mail or electronic commerce, if permitted by rule of the 22 department and if the applicant did not renew his or her identicard 23 by mail or by electronic commerce when it last expired.

An identicard may not be renewed by mail or by electronic commerce unless the renewal issued by the department includes a photograph of the identicard holder.

(4) Cancellation. The department may cancel an identicard if the
 holder of the identicard used the card or allowed others to use the
 card in violation of RCW 46.20.0921.

30 (5) <u>Any person may apply to the department to obtain a medical</u> 31 <u>alert designation, a developmental disability designation, or a</u> 32 <u>deafness designation on an identicard issued under this chapter by</u> 33 <u>providing:</u>

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(a) Self-attestation that the individual:

35 (i) Has a medical condition that could affect communication or 36 account for a health emergency;

37 (ii) Is deaf or hard of hearing; or

38 <u>(iii) Has a developmental disability as defined in RCW</u> 39 <u>71A.10.020;</u>

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1 (b) A statement from the person that they have voluntarily 2 provided the self-attestation and other information verifying the 3 condition; and 4 (c) For persons under eighteen years of age or who have a

5 <u>developmental disability</u>, the signature of a parent or legal 6 <u>guardian</u>.

7 (6) A self-attestation or data contained in a self-attestation
8 provided under this section:

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(a) Shall not be disclosed; and

10 (b) Is for the confidential use of the director, the chief of the 11 <u>Washington state patrol, and for law enforcement and emergency</u> 12 <u>medical service providers as designated by law.</u>

(7) Alternative issuance/renewal/extension. The department may 13 issue or renew an identicard for a period other than six years, or 14 may extend by mail or electronic commerce an identicard that has 15 already been issued, in order to evenly distribute, as nearly as 16 17 possible, the yearly renewal rate of identicard holders. The fee for an identicard issued or renewed for a period other than six years, or 18 that has been extended by mail or electronic commerce, is nine 19 dollars for each year that the identicard is issued, renewed, or 20 21 extended. The department may adopt any rules as are necessary to 22 carry out this subsection.

23 Sec. 3. RCW 46.20.161 and 2018 c 69 s 1 are each amended to read 24 as follows:

25 (1) The department, upon receipt of a fee of forty-five dollars from October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, and fifty-four dollars after 26 27 June 30, 2013, unless the driver's license is issued for a period other than five years from October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, or six 28 years after June 30, 2013, in which case the fee shall be nine 29 30 dollars for each year that the license is issued, which includes the 31 fee for the required photograph, shall issue to every qualifying applicant a driver's license. A driver's license issued to a person 32 under the age of eighteen is an intermediate license, subject to the 33 restrictions imposed under RCW 46.20.075, until the person reaches 34 35 the age of eighteen.

36 <u>(2)</u> The license must include:

37 (a) A distinguishing number assigned to the licensee((τ));

38 (b) The name of record $((\tau))$;

39 (c) <u>D</u>ate of birth((τ));

1 (d) Washington residence address((τ));

2 (e) <u>Photograph((τ));</u>

3 (f) A brief description of the licensee((τ));

4 (g) Either a facsimile of the signature of the licensee or a 5 space upon which the licensee shall write his or her usual signature 6 with pen and ink immediately upon receipt of the license((r - and r));

7 <u>(h) If applicable, the person's status as a veteran as provided</u> 8 in subsection (((2))) <u>(4)</u> of this section; and

9 <u>(i) If applicable, a medical alert designation as provided in</u> 10 <u>subsection (5) of this section</u>.

11 <u>(3)</u> No license is valid until it has been ((so)) signed by the 12 licensee.

13 (((2))) (4)(a) A veteran, as defined in RCW 41.04.007, or an 14 individual who otherwise meets the criteria of RCW 41.04.007 but who 15 has received a general discharge under honorable conditions, may 16 apply to the department to obtain a veteran designation on a driver's 17 license issued under this section by providing:

18 (((a))) <u>(i)</u> A United States department of veterans affairs 19 identification card or proof of service letter;

20 (((b))) (ii) A United States department of defense discharge 21 document, DD Form 214 or DD Form 215, as it exists on June 7, 2018, 22 or such subsequent date as may be provided by the department by rule, 23 consistent with the purposes of this section, or equivalent or 24 successor discharge paperwork, that shows a discharge status of 25 "honorable" or "general under honorable conditions" that establishes 26 the person's service in the armed forces of the United States;

(((c))) <u>(iii)</u> A national guard state-issued report of separation and military service, NGB Form 22, as it exists on June 7, 2018, or such subsequent date as may be provided by the department by rule, consistent with the purposes of this section, or equivalent or successor discharge paperwork, that shows a discharge status of "honorable" or "general under honorable conditions" that establishes the person's active duty or reserve service in the national guard; or

34 (((d))) <u>(iv)</u> A United States uniformed services identification 35 card, DD Form 2, that displays on its face that it has been issued to 36 a retired member of any of the armed forces of the United States, 37 including the national guard and armed forces reserves.

38 (b) The department may permit a veteran, as defined in RCW 39 41.04.007, or an individual who otherwise meets the criteria of RCW 40 41.04.007 but who has received a general discharge under honorable Code Rev/AI:akl 4 H-5033.1/20 1 conditions, to submit an alternate form of documentation to apply to 2 obtain a veteran designation on a driver's license, as specified by 3 rule, that requires a discharge status of "honorable" or "general 4 under honorable conditions" and that establishes the person's service 5 as required under RCW 41.04.007.

6 (5) Any person may apply to the department to obtain a medical 7 alert designation, a developmental disability designation, or a 8 deafness designation on a driver's license issued under this chapter 9 by providing:

10 (a) Self-attestation that the individual:

11 (i) Has a medical condition that could affect communication or 12 account for a driver health emergency;

13 (ii) Is deaf or hard of hearing; or

14 <u>(iii) Has a developmental disability as defined in RCW</u> 15 <u>71A.10.020;</u>

16 (b) A statement from the person that they have voluntarily 17 provided the self-attestation and other information verifying the 18 condition; and

19 (c) For persons under eighteen years of age or who have a 20 <u>developmental disability</u>, the signature of a parent or legal 21 <u>guardian</u>.

22 (6) A self-attestation or data contained in a self-attestation
23 provided under this section:

24 <u>(a) Shall not be disclosed;</u>

25 (b) Is for the confidential use of the director, the chief of the 26 <u>Washington state patrol, and for law enforcement and emergency</u> 27 medical service providers as designated by law; and

28 (c) Is subject to the privacy protections of the driver's privacy
29 protection act, 18 U.S.C. Sec. 2725.

30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. This act takes effect January 1, 2022."

31 Correct the title.

EFFECT: Adds individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing or who have a developmental disability to those eligible for a medical alert designation on a driver's license or identicard. Individuals who apply for a medical alert designation must provide self-attestation of the condition, rather than certification from a licensed health professional, to obtain the designation. Adds individuals with developmental disabilities to those who must also provide a signature

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of a parent or legal guardian to be eligible. Changes the effective date from July 1, 2020, to January 1, 2022.

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
