28 ~~(D))~~ RECOMMITMENT BEFORE FINAL PASSAGE. A bill may be
29 recommitted at any time before its final passage.

30 (B) FINAL PASSAGE. No bill shall become a law unless on its
31 final passage the vote be taken by yeas and nays, the names of the

1 members voting for and against the same be entered on the journal of
2 each house, and a majority of the members elected to each house be
3 recorded thereon as voting in its favor. (Art. II § 22)

4 (C) BUDGET BILLS. No final passage vote may be taken on an
5 operating budget, transportation budget, or capital budget bill until
6 twenty-four (24) hours after the bill is placed on the third reading
7 calendar. No final passage vote may be taken on an operating budget
8 bill until any revenue bills necessary for the operating budget bill
9 to comply with the balanced budget requirement of RCW 43.88.055 have
10 been approved on third reading by a majority vote of members elected
11 to the House. The requirements of this subsection do not apply to
12 conference reports, which are governed by Joint Rule 20, or to bills
13 placed on the third reading calendar by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of
14 the members present.

15 (D) FISCAL NOTES. No final passage vote may be taken on a bill
16 unless a final, complete fiscal note prepared under chapter 43.88A
17 RCW is available for that version of the bill. This requirement does
18 not apply to the operating, transportation, or capital budget bills,
19 to conference reports, or to bills placed on the third reading
20 calendar by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present.

21 (E) BILLS WITH SIGNIFICANT FISCAL IMPACT. If a bill has a
22 significant fiscal impact, then no final passage vote may be taken on
23 the bill unless the bill contains a nonbinding declaration of
24 legislative intent that explains which revenues the legislature
25 intends to increase or which expenditures the legislature intends to
26 decrease to pay for the projected costs of the bill. For the purposes
27 of this subsection, "significant fiscal impact" means that for the
28 current version of the bill, the fiscal note prepared under chapter
29 43.88A RCW or other fiscal estimate reasonably projects that the bill
30 is likely to result in an expenditure increase of more than ten
31 million dollars, and "expenditure increase" means a net increase in
32 state expenditures over the ensuing three biennia from the state
33 general fund and related funds as defined in RCW 43.88.055 as
34 compared to the expenditure levels authorized in the current
35 biennium's operating appropriations act from those funds.
