- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28A.600 7 RCW to read as follows:
  - (1) Beginning with the 2020-21 school year, public schools must annually report information about each diagnosed concussion sustained by a student during athletic and other activities using a procedure developed by the department of health under section 2 of this act.

- 11 (2) Beginning October 1, 2021, by October 1st annually
  12 thereafter, and in compliance with RCW 43.01.036, the department
  13 shall report a summary of the diagnosed concussion information
  14 received in the prior school year to the appropriate committees of
  15 the legislature and the office of the superintendent of public
  16 instruction. The report must include rates, patterns, trends, and
  17 other relevant information.
