1 AN ACT Relating to making expenditures from the budget 2 stabilization account for declared catastrophic events; creating a 3 new section; making an appropriation; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. On July 31, 2018, the governor declared a 6 state of emergency in all counties due to threats to life and 7 property from existing and threatened wildfires.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES-8 FIRES. The sum of forty-two million three hundred forty-two thousand 9 dollars is appropriated from the budget stabilization account for the 10 11 fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, and is provided solely for fire suppression costs incurred by the department of natural resources 12 13 during the 2018 fire season. For purposes of RCW 43.88.055(4), the 14 appropriation in this section does not alter the requirement to 15 balance in ensuing biennia.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate 17 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 18 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 19 effect immediately. Passed by the House April 25, 2019. Passed by the Senate April 28, 2019. Approved by the Governor May 21, 2019. Filed in Office of Secretary of State May 21, 2019.

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
