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- 1 AN ACT Relating to the access to baby and child dentistry program
- 2 for children with disabilities; and amending RCW 74.09.390.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 74.09.390 and 2018 c 156 s 1 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
 - (1) Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this specific purpose, the authority shall expand the access to baby and child dentistry (ABCD) program to include eligible children ((with disabilities)) as ((eligible)) clients.
- 10 (2) Once enrolled in the program, eligible children ((with 11 disabilities)) must be covered until their thirteenth birthday.
- 12 (3) <u>Eligible children ((with disabilities))</u> enrolled in the 13 program shall receive all services and benefits received by program 14 clients.
- 15 (4) The authority shall pay enhanced fees for program services 16 provided to <u>eligible</u> children ((with disabilities)) enrolled in the program to dentists, primary care providers, and dental hygienists 17 18 provide to program services ((to children with 19 disabilities)). To receive certification to provide program services 20 to <u>eligible</u> children ((with disabilities)), a dentist, primary care

1 (a) Be licensed under Title 18 RCW; and

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- (b) Complete a course on treating eligible children ((with 2 disabilities)) as defined by the authority in rule. 3
 - (5) On or before December 15, ((2018)) 2020, and on or before December 15, ((2019)) 2021, the authority, in consultation with any organizations administering the program, shall provide a report, in compliance with RCW 43.01.036, to the health care and fiscal committees of the legislature, to include:
- (a) The number of dentists, primary care providers, and dental 9 hygienists participating in the program; and 10
- (b) The number of eligible children ((with disabilities)) who 11 12 received treatment through the program.
 - (6) For purposes of this section:
- "<u>Eliqible c</u>hildren ((with disabilities))" means 14 (a) all individuals who meet clinical criteria established by the authority, 15 who are under the age of thirteen with a disability attributable to 17 intellectual disability, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism, or another neurological condition closely related to an intellectual disability 18 19 or that requires treatment similar to that required for persons with intellectual disabilities, which has continued or can be expected to 20 21 continue indefinitely, and which constitutes a substantial limitation 22 to such individual, who are eligible for one of the following medical 23 assistance programs:
 - (i) Categorically needy program;
- 25 (ii) Limited casualty program-medically needy program;
 - (iii) Children's health program; or
- 27 (iv) State children's health insurance program.
- 28 (b) "Program" means the access to baby and child dentistry 29 program as established by WAC 182-535-1245 or successor rule.
