## HOUSE BILL 1622

## State of Washington 67th Legislature 2022 Regular Session

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AN ACT Relating to increasing the availability of sexual assault nurse examiner education in rural and underserved areas; adding new sections to chapter 28B.30 RCW; creating a new section; and providing an expiration date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that:

7 (1) Most organizations recognize that the didactic training of 8 health care professionals performing the medical forensic examination 9 should consist of at least 40 hours;

10 (2) Training of sexual assault nurse examiners should include11 hands-on clinical skills training and competency checks;

(3) Disparities persist between the training that is available to
nurses in rural communities, including a lack of hands-on clinical
skills training and a lack of 40-hour didactic classes;

(4) Best practice for the clinical education of nurses includesthe use of simulation in an interdisciplinary context;

(5) Promotion of equal access to 40-hour didactic classes and supporting the development of clinical training mechanisms will help to ensure consistency and quality of care throughout the state; and

20 (6) Washington State University has the capacity to offer high 21 quality, simulation-based, inter-professional training for sexual

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1 assault nurse examiners and to increase access to education for 2 nurses in rural communities.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28B.30
4 RCW to read as follows:

5 (1) The Washington State University college of nursing shall 6 establish a program to increase the availability of qualified sexual 7 assault nurse examiners in eastern Washington. The program must, at a 8 minimum, include the following elements:

9 (a) Online training resources to provide nurses in rural and 10 underserved communities access to at least 40 hours of didactic 11 training;

(b) A clinical training site at the Washington State University school of nursing at which nurses may complete the clinical training requirements established by the United States department of justice; and

16 (c) Scholarships for nurses to complete the online training, the 17 clinical training, or both.

18 (2) The Washington State University college of nursing shall 19 submit annual reports to the appropriate committees of the 20 legislature in accordance with RCW 43.01.036 on the use and impact of 21 the online and clinical training established in this section.

22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 28B.30 23 RCW to read as follows:

(1) The Washington State University college of nursing shall
 establish a regional sexual assault nurse examiner leader pilot
 program. Regional lead sexual assault nurse examiners participating
 in the program shall:

(a) Establish the number of active sexual assault nurse examinersin their communities;

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(b) Report on the educational needs of their communities;

31 (c) Produce recommendations on how to best increase the number of 32 sexual assault nurse examiners in their communities; and

33 (d) Develop community-based action plans for sexual assault nurse 34 examiner recruitment.

35 (2) The Washington State University college of nursing shall:

36 (a) Develop and train lead sexual assault nurse examiners; and

37 (b) Assist in the development of support mechanisms and role 38 requirements for regional lead sexual assault nurse examiners. 1 (3) The Washington State University college of nursing shall 2 submit to the appropriate committees of the legislature in accordance 3 with RCW 43.01.036 annual reports on the impact of the pilot program 4 with a final report due no later than January 1, 2026.

5 (4) This section expires July 1, 2026.

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
