- 1 AN ACT Relating to the employment of individuals who lawfully
- 2 consume cannabis; and adding a new section to chapter 49.44 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 49.44 5 RCW to read as follows:
 - (1) Except as otherwise specifically provided in law:
- 7 (a) It is unlawful for any employer in this state to fail or 8 refuse to hire a prospective employee because the prospective 9 employee submitted to a screening test and the results of the 10 screening test indicate the presence of cannabis; and
- 11 (b) It is unlawful for any employer in this state to terminate a 12 current employee because the current employee submitted to a 13 screening test and the results of the screening test indicate the 14 presence of cannabis.
 - (2) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply:
- 16 (a) If compliance would cause an employer to lose a monetary or licensing-related benefit under federal law;
- 18 (b) To the extent they are inconsistent or otherwise in conflict 19 with the provisions of an employment contract or collective 20 bargaining agreement;

- 1 (c) To the extent they are inconsistent or otherwise in conflict 2 with the provisions of federal law; or
 - (d) To a position of employment funded by a federal grant.
 - (3) For the purposes of this section:

- 5 (a) "Cannabis" has the meaning provided for "marijuana" under RCW 69.50.101; and
- 7 (b) "Screening test" means a test of a person's blood, urine, 8 hair, or saliva to detect the general presence of a controlled 9 substance or any other drug.
