- AN ACT Relating to providing financial relief to hotels, motels, and other lodging facilities impacted by the eviction moratorium;
- 3 adding a new section to chapter 84.36 RCW; adding a new section to
- 4 chapter 43.330 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 84.36 7 RCW to read as follows:
 - (1) A lodging facility housing long-term guests under the eviction moratorium is exempt from taxation for property taxes levied for collection in 2022 and 2023, as described under this section.
- 11 (2)(a) Claims for an exemption under this section must be filed 12 with the county assessor on forms provided by the department and 13 furnished by the county assessor.
 - (b) The forms must include documentation, in a manner as prescribed by the department, that at least one occupant of the lodging facility properly evoked their right to cease making lodging payments pursuant to the eviction moratorium for each reporting year in which the property owner claims an exemption under this section.
- 19 (3) The department may adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 34.05 20 RCW, as necessary to implement this section.

- 4 (a) "Eviction moratorium" refers to the governor of the state of Washington's proclamation 20-19.5, proclaiming a moratorium on certain evictions for all counties throughout Washington state on December 31, 2020, and any subsequent orders extending or amending such proclamation until it expires or is terminated by the governor of the state of Washington.
- 10 (b) "Lodging facility" means any building held out to the public 11 as an inn, hotel, motel, or other public lodging house where sleeping 12 accommodations are furnished for hire to transient guests, in which 13 three or more rooms are used for the accommodation of such guests.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 43.330 RCW to read as follows:
- 16 (1) The department must administer reimbursements to lodging 17 facility operators, as provided in this section.
- 18 (2) Reimbursements must be sufficient to cover all legal costs 19 associated with removal of a long-term guest no longer making lodging 20 payments under the eviction moratorium.
- 21 (3) The department may adopt rules as necessary to implement this section.
 - (4) For the purposes of this section:
 - (a) "Eviction moratorium" and "lodging facility" have the same meanings as in section 1 of this act.
- 26 (b) "Legal costs" means attorney fees, court filing costs,
 27 expenses associated with repairing property damage or property
 28 maintenance including, but not limited to, cleaning of premises,
 29 removal of abandoned property, disposal of hazardous material, and
 30 any other costs the department considers appropriate for
 31 reimbursement.
- 32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The provisions of RCW 82.32.805 and 82.32.808 do not apply to this act.
