1 AN ACT Relating to students affiliated with the military; and
2 amending RCW 28B.15.012.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.012 and 2021 c 272 s 9 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 Whenever used in this chapter:

7 (1) The term "institution" shall mean a public university,
8 college, or community or technical college within the state of
9 Washington.

10 (2) The term "resident student" shall mean:

11 (a) A financially independent student who has had a domicile in
12 the state of Washington for the period of one year immediately prior
13 to the time of commencement of the first day of the semester or
14 quarter for which the student has registered at any institution and
15 has in fact established a bona fide domicile in this state primarily
16 for purposes other than educational;

17 (b) A dependent student, if one or both of the student's parents
18 or legal guardians have maintained a bona fide domicile in the state
19 of Washington for at least one year immediately prior to commencement
20 of the semester or quarter for which the student has registered at
21 any institution;

1 (c) A student classified as a resident based upon domicile by an
2 institution on or before May 31, 1982, who was enrolled at a state
3 institution during any term of the 1982-1983 academic year, so long
4 as such student's enrollment (excepting summer sessions) at an
5 institution in this state is continuous;

6 (d) Any student who has spent at least seventy-five percent of
7 both his or her junior and senior years in high schools in this
8 state, whose parents or legal guardians have been domiciled in the
9 state for a period of at least one year within the five-year period
10 before the student graduates from high school, and who enrolls in a
11 public institution of higher education within six months of leaving
12 high school, for as long as the student remains continuously enrolled
13 for three quarters or two semesters in any calendar year;

14 (e) Any person who has completed and obtained a high school
15 diploma, or a person who has received the equivalent of a diploma;
16 who has continuously lived in the state of Washington for at least a
17 year for purposes other than educational before the individual is
18 admitted to an institution of higher education under subsection (1)
19 of this section; and who provides to the institution an affidavit
20 indicating that the individual will file an application to become a
21 permanent resident at the earliest opportunity the individual is
22 eligible to do so and a willingness to engage in any other activities
23 necessary to acquire citizenship, including but not limited to
24 citizenship or civics review courses;

25 (f) Any person who has lived in Washington, primarily for
26 purposes other than educational, for at least one year immediately
27 before the date on which the person has enrolled in an institution,
28 and who holds lawful nonimmigrant status pursuant to 8 U.S.C. Sec.
29 (a)(15) (E)(iii), (H)(i), or (L), or who holds lawful nonimmigrant
30 status as the spouse or child of a person having nonimmigrant status
31 under one of those subsections, or who, holding or having previously
32 held such lawful nonimmigrant status as a principal or derivative,
33 has filed an application for adjustment of status pursuant to 8
34 U.S.C. Sec. 1255(a);

35 (g) A student who is ~~((~~en~~))~~ one of the following:

36 (i) On active military duty ((stationed in the state or who is
37 a));

38 (ii) A member of the ((Washington)) army or air national guard as
39 defined in subsection (10) of this section, regardless of active
40 military status; or

1 (iii) A member of the reserve component of the United States
2 army, navy, air force, or marine corps;

24 was discharged due to the student's sexual orientation or gender
25 identity or expression;

34 U.S.C. Sec. 3679(c)(2) as it existed on ~~((July 28, 2019))~~ August 27,
35 2021, or such subsequent date as the student achievement council may

10 ~~(w) A student who resides in Washington and is on active military~~
11 ~~duty stationed in the Oregon counties of Columbia, Gilliam, Hood~~
12 ~~River, Multnomah, Clatsop, Clackamas, Morrow, Sherman, Umatilla,~~
13 ~~Union, Wallowa, Wasco, or Washington; or~~

14 ~~(x) A student who resides in Washington and is the spouse or a~~

29 higher education shall retain resident student status.

30 ~~((b) Nothing in subsection (2) (k), (m), (n), (o), (p), (q), (r),~~
31 ~~(s), or (t) of this section applies to students who have a~~
32 ~~dishonorable discharge from the uniformed services, or to students~~
33 ~~who are the spouse or child of an individual who has had a~~
34 ~~dishonorable discharge from the uniformed services, unless the~~
35 ~~student is receiving veterans administration educational assistance~~
36 ~~benefits.))~~

37 (4) The term "nonresident student" shall mean any student who
38 does not qualify as a "resident student" under the provisions of this
39 section and RCW 28B.15.013. Except for students qualifying under

1 subsection (2)(e) (~~(or (u))~~) of this section, a nonresident student
2 shall include:

3 (a) A student attending an institution with the aid of financial
4 assistance provided by another state or governmental unit or agency
5 thereof, such nonresidency continuing for one year after the
6 completion of such semester or quarter. This condition shall not
7 apply to students from Columbia, Multnomah, Clatsop, Clackamas, or
8 Washington county, Oregon participating in the border county pilot
9 project under RCW 28B.76.685, 28B.76.690, and 28B.15.0139.

10 (b) A person who is not a citizen of the United States of
11 America, unless the person meets and complies with all applicable
12 requirements in this section and RCW 28B.15.013 and is one of the
13 following:

14 (i) A lawful permanent resident;

15 (ii) A temporary resident;

16 (iii) A person who holds "refugee-parolee," "conditional
17 entrant," or U or T nonimmigrant status with the United States
18 citizenship and immigration services;

19 (iv) A person who has been issued an employment authorization
20 document by the United States citizenship and immigration services
21 that is valid as of the date the person's residency status is
22 determined;

23 (v) A person who has been granted deferred action for childhood
24 arrival status before, on, or after June 7, 2018, regardless of
25 whether the person is no longer or will no longer be granted deferred
26 action for childhood arrival status due to the termination,
27 suspension, or modification of the deferred action for childhood
28 arrival program; or

29 (vi) A person who is otherwise permanently residing in the United
30 States under color of law, including deferred action status.

31 (5) The term "domicile" shall denote a person's true, fixed and
32 permanent home and place of habitation. It is the place where the
33 student intends to remain, and to which the student expects to return
34 when the student leaves without intending to establish a new domicile
35 elsewhere. The burden of proof that a student, parent or guardian has
36 established a domicile in the state of Washington primarily for
37 purposes other than educational lies with the student.

38 (6) The term "dependent" shall mean a person who is not
39 financially independent. Factors to be considered in determining
40 whether a person is financially independent shall be set forth in

1 rules adopted by the student achievement council and shall include,
2 but not be limited to, the state and federal income tax returns of
3 the person and/or the student's parents or legal guardian filed for
4 the calendar year prior to the year in which application is made and
5 such other evidence as the council may require.

6 (7) The term "active military duty" means the person is serving
7 on active duty in:

8 (a) The armed forces of the United States government; or

9 (b) The (~~Washington~~) national guard; or

10 (c) The coast guard, merchant mariners, or other nonmilitary
11 organization when such service is recognized by the United States
12 government as equivalent to service in the armed forces.

13 (8) The term "active duty service" means full-time duty, other
14 than active duty for training, as a member of the uniformed services
15 of the United States. Active duty service as a national guard member
16 under Title 32 U.S.C. for the purpose of organizing, administering,
17 recruiting, instructing, or training and active service under Title
18 32 U.S.C. Sec. 502(f) for the purpose of responding to a national
19 emergency is recognized as active duty service.

20 (9) The term "uniformed services" is defined by Title 10 U.S.C.;
21 subsequently structured and organized by Titles 14, 33, and 42
22 U.S.C.; consisting of the United States army, United States marine
23 corps, United States navy, United States air force, United States
24 coast guard, United States space force, United States public health
25 service commissioned corps, and the national oceanic and atmospheric
26 administration commissioned officer corps.

27 (10) "National guard" means that part of the military force of
28 the state that is organized, equipped, and federally recognized under
29 the provisions of the national defense act of the Untied States, and
30 in the event the national guard is called into federal service or in
31 the event the state guard or any part or individual member thereof is
32 called into active state service by the commander-in-chief. National
33 guard service includes being subject to call up for active duty under
34 Title 32 U.S.C. or Title 10 U.S.C. status or when called to state
35 active service by the governor under the provisions of RCW 38.08.040.

36 (11) "Child" includes, but is not limited to:

37 (a) A legitimate child;

38 (b) An adopted child;

39 (c) A stepchild;

40 (d) A foster child; and

1 (e) A legal dependent.

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
