- 1 AN ACT Relating to providing funding for medical evaluations of
- 2 suspected victims of child abuse; adding new sections to chapter 7.68
- 3 RCW; and creating new sections.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the crime
- 6 victims' compensation fund was established in 1973 to cover medical
- 7 bills and other costs associated with being the victim of a crime.
- 8 The legislature finds that state law requires the crime victims'
- 9 compensation fund to pay the costs of sexual assault examinations of
- 10 minors when they are performed to gather evidence for possible
- 11 prosecution. The legislature finds that in 2015, the legislature
- 12 passed Substitute Senate Bill No. 5897 to provide funding for medical
- 13 evaluations of suspected child victims of physical abuse. The
- 14 legislature finds that this law expired June 30, 2019, and was not
- 15 extended in the omnibus operating appropriations act. The legislature
- 16 recognizes that while sexual assault examinations are currently
- 17 provided for by the crime victims' compensation fund, examinations
- 18 for child victims of physical assault are not provided for. The
- 19 legislature finds that medical examinations are important for
- 20 children who may be victims of physical abuse. The legislature finds
- 21 that contributing to the cost of these examinations will incentivize

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- 1 timely evaluations, lead to early identification of abuse, and
- 2 potentially prevent a child from further traumatization or injury.
- 3 The legislature therefore resolves to reenact the provision of
- 4 medical examinations of children who may be victims of physical
- 5 abuse.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 7.68 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) No costs incurred by an institution as defined in RCW 8 9 26.44.020 for the examination of a suspected victim of assault of a 10 child under chapter 9A.36 RCW may be billed or charged directly or 11 indirectly to the suspected victim of the assault. Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this specific purpose, the 12 department must pay all costs incurred by an institution as defined 13 in RCW 26.44.020 for the examination of a suspected victim of assault 14 15 of a child, provided that the cost of the examination would not 16 otherwise be covered by the department.
- 17 (2) The department must notify the office of financial management 18 and the fiscal committees of the legislature if it projects that the 19 cost of services provided under this section exceeds the amount of 20 funding provided by the legislature solely for the purposes of this 21 section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 7.68 RCW to read as follows:
- By November 1, 2023, and annually thereafter, and in compliance 24 25 with RCW 43.01.036, the department must submit a report to the 26 legislature and governor with the following information: The number of requests to pay for physical abuse exams for child victims of 27 physical assault pursuant to section 2 of this act, how many of these 28 29 requests are approved and denied including the reasons for denial, 30 how many of the exams are covered for another reason, and any other information the department believes is beneficial. 31
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. If specific funding for the purposes of this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 2022, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and void.

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
