1 AN ACT Relating to the developmental disabilities
2 administration's no-paid services caseload; adding a new section to
3 chapter 71A.10 RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 71A.10
6 RCW to read as follows:

7 (1) The department shall hire two permanent, full-time employees
8 to regularly review and maintain the no-paid services caseload. This
9 includes, but is not limited to, updating the no-paid services
10 caseload to accurately reflect a current headcount of eligible
11 individuals and identifying the number of individuals contacted who
12 are currently interested in receiving a paid service from the
13 developmental disabilities administration and if the individual would
14 like services now or within the next year. Beginning December 1,
15 2022, the department shall annually report this information to the
16 governor and the appropriate committees of the legislature.

17 (2) A client on the no-paid services caseload shall receive case
18 resource management services. The case resource manager's duties
19 include: (a) Contacting and responding to the client to discuss the
20 client's service needs, and (b) explaining to the client the service

2 resources.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** If specific funding for the purposes of
4 this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not
5 provided by June 30, 2022, in the omnibus appropriations act, this
6 act is null and void.

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
