- AN ACT Relating to extending the expiration date for reporting requirements on timber purchases; amending RCW 84.33.088; providing an effective date; providing an expiration date; and declaring an emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

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- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 84.33.088 and 2017 c 55 s 1 are each amended to read as follows:
 - (1) A purchaser of privately owned timber in an amount in excess of ((two hundred thousand)) 200,000 board feet in a voluntary sale made in the ordinary course of business must, on or before the last day of the month following the purchase of the timber, report the particulars of the purchase to the department as required in subsection (2) of this section.
- (2) The report required in subsection (1) of this section must 14 15 contain all information relevant to the value of the timber purchased 16 including, but not limited to, the following, as 17 Purchaser's name, address, and contact information; seller's name, address, and contact information; sale date; termination date in sale 18 19 agreement; total sale price; legal description of sale area, sale name if applicable; forest practice application/harvest permit number 20 21 if available; total acreage involved in the sale; estimated net

- 31 (4) Privately purchased timber reports are confidential taxpayer 32 information under RCW 82.32.330.
- 33 (5) This section expires ((July 1, 2021)) <u>September 30, 2025</u>.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect June 30, 2021.
