1 AN ACT Relating to license renewals for cosmetologists, hair 2 designers, barbers, manicurists, and estheticians; amending RCW 3 18.16.110; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. It is the intent of the legislature to 6 help resolve issues relating to professional licensing for 7 cosmetologists, hair designers, barbers, manicurists, estheticians, master estheticians, and instructors. The COVID-19 pandemic has 8 9 affected all Washingtonians in different ways, and many people 10 licensed to instruct or practice cosmetology, hair design, barbering, 11 manicuring, and esthetics may not have renewed their license within 12 the one year expiration window and, as a result, had their license 13 canceled. The legislature intends to allow individuals whose licenses 14 were canceled for failure to renew within the expiration period 15 during the pandemic an opportunity to renew their license. Moving 16 forward, the legislature intends to study barriers to maintaining a 17 professional cosmetologist license in order to address this issue in 18 a comprehensive way in the 2023 legislative session.

19 Sec. 2. RCW 18.16.110 and 2004 c 51 s 3 are each amended to read 20 as follows: 1 (1) The director shall issue the appropriate license to any 2 applicant who meets the requirements as outlined in this chapter.

(2) Except as provided in RCW 18.16.260:

4 (a) Failure to renew a license by its expiration date subjects
5 the holder to a penalty fee and payment of each year's renewal fee,
6 at the current rate; and

7 (b) A person whose license has not been renewed within one year after its expiration date shall have the license canceled and shall 8 be required to submit an application, pay the license fee, meet 9 current licensing requirements, and pass any applicable examination 10 11 or examinations, in addition to the other requirements of this chapter, before the license may be reinstated, provided that a person 12 whose license expired on or after March 1, 2020, may renew the 13 license, including if the license was canceled, until June 30, 2023. 14

(3) In lieu of the requirements of subsection (2)(a) of this 15 16 section, a license placed on inactive status under RCW 18.16.290 may 17 be reinstated to good standing upon receipt by the department of: (a) Payment of a renewal fee, without penalty, for a two-year license 18 commencing on the date the license is reinstated; and (b) if the 19 license was on inactive status during any time that the board finds 20 21 that a health or other requirement applicable to the license has changed, evidence showing that the holder of the license has 22 successfully completed, from a school licensed under RCW 18.16.140, 23 at least the number of curriculum clock hours of instruction that the 24 25 board deems necessary for a licensee to be brought current with 26 respect to such changes, but in no case may the number of hours required under this subsection exceed four hours per year that the 27 license was on inactive status. 28

(4) Nothing in this section authorizes a person whose license has
 expired or is on inactive status to engage in a practice prohibited
 under RCW 18.16.060 until the license is renewed or reinstated.

32 (5) Upon request and payment of an additional fee to be 33 established by rule by the director, the director shall issue a 34 duplicate license to an applicant.
