- 1 AN ACT Relating to tracked and wheeled all-terrain vehicles;
- 2 amending RCW 46.10.300; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW;
- 3 adding a new section to chapter 46.10 RCW; and adding a new section
- 4 to chapter 46.09 RCW.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.10.300 and 2019 c 262 s 5 are each amended to read as follows:
- 8 The following definitions apply throughout this chapter unless 9 the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 10 (1) "All-terrain vehicle" means any self-propelled vehicle other 11 than a snowmobile, capable of cross-country travel on or immediately
- 12 over land, water, snow, ice, marsh, swampland, and other natural
- 13 terrain, including, but not limited to, four-wheel vehicles,
- 14 amphibious vehicles, ground effect or air cushion vehicles, and any
- 15 other means of land transportation deriving motive power from any
- 15 Other means of rand cramsportation activing motive power from any
- 16 source other than muscle or wind; except any vehicle designed
- 17 primarily for travel on, over, or in the water, farm vehicles, or any
- 18 military or law enforcement vehicles.
- 19 (2) "Commission" means the Washington state parks and recreation

20 commission.

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1 (3) "Committee" means the Washington state parks and recreation commission snowmobile advisory committee. 2

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- (4) "Dealer" means a person, partnership, association, or corporation engaged in the business of selling snowmobiles or allterrain vehicles at wholesale or retail in this state.
- 6 (5) "Highway" means the entire width of the right-of-way of a 7 primary and secondary state highway, including any portion of the interstate highway system. 8
- (6) "Hunt" means any effort to kill, injure, capture, or disturb 9 a wild animal or wild bird. 10
- (7) "Public roadway" means the entire width of the right-of-way 11 of any road or street designed and ordinarily used for travel or parking of motor vehicles, which is controlled by a public authority 13 other than the Washington state department of transportation, and 14 which is open as a matter of right to the general public for ordinary 15 16 vehicular traffic.
- 17 (8) "Snowmobile" means ((both)) "snowmobile" as defined in RCW 18 46.04.546 ((and)), "snow bike" as defined in RCW 46.04.545, and "tracked all-terrain vehicle" as defined in section 2 of this act. 19
- 20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04 21 RCW to read as follows:
- 22 "Tracked all-terrain vehicle" means any "wheeled all-terrain vehicle" as defined in RCW 46.09.310 and weighing less than two 23 24 thousand pounds in stock configuration, with tracks or a combination 25 of tracks and skis installed in place of the standard low-pressure 26 tires.
- 27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 46.10 28 RCW to read as follows:
- 29 The owner of a wheeled all-terrain vehicle weighing less than two thousand pounds in stock configuration, when properly converted, as a 30 tracked all-terrain vehicle, may apply for a snowmobile registration 31 as provided in section 4 of this act and under the terms and for the 32 33 purposes of this chapter.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 46.09 34 RCW to read as follows: 35
- 36 (1) It is the intent of the legislature to create a concurrent licensing process to allow the owner of a wheeled all-terrain vehicle 37

p. 2 SB 5016.SL to maintain concurrent but separate registrations for the vehicle, for use as a wheeled all-terrain vehicle and for use as a tracked all-terrain vehicle.

- (2) The department shall allow the owner of a wheeled all-terrain vehicle to maintain concurrent licenses for the vehicle for use as a wheeled all-terrain vehicle and for use as a tracked all-terrain vehicle. When the vehicle is registered as a wheeled all-terrain vehicle, the terms of the registration are those under this chapter that apply to wheeled all-terrain vehicles, including applicable fees. When the vehicle is registered as a tracked all-terrain vehicle, the terms of the registration are those under chapter 46.10 RCW that apply to snowmobiles, including applicable fees.
- (3) The department shall establish a declaration, which must be submitted by the wheeled all-terrain vehicle owner when initially applying for a snowmobile registration under chapter 46.10 RCW for the use of the converted wheeled all-terrain vehicle as a tracked all-terrain vehicle. The declaration must include a statement signed by the owner that a wheeled all-terrain vehicle that had been previously converted to a tracked all-terrain vehicle must conform with all applicable federal motor vehicle safety standards and state standards while in use as a wheeled all-terrain vehicle upon public roads, streets, or highways. Once submitted by the wheeled all-terrain vehicle owner, the declaration is valid until the vehicle is sold or the title is otherwise transferred.
  - (4) The department may adopt rules to implement this section.
