1 AN ACT Relating to prohibiting dual enrollment between school
2 employees' benefits board and public employees' benefits board
3 programs; and amending RCW 41.05.742.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 41.05.742 and 2020 c 8 s 4 are each amended to read
6 as follows:

7 Beginning with the 2022 plan year, individuals are limited to a
8 single enrollment in medical, dental, and vision plans (~~among~~) in
9 either the school employees' benefits board (~~and~~) or the public
10 employees' benefits board (~~plans. However, individuals may be~~
11 ~~enrolled in both public employees' benefits board and school~~
12 ~~employees' benefits board plans as long as those enrollments are~~
13 ~~across different types of plans, such as medical, dental, and~~
14 ~~vision)).~~ The school employees' benefits board and the public
15 employees' benefits board shall adopt policies to reflect this single
16 enrollment requirement.
