1 AN ACT Relating to extending the expiration date of certain
2 sections of chapter 92, Laws of 2019, regarding livestock
3 identification; amending RCW 16.57.460; amending 2019 c 92 s 14
4 (uncodified); and providing expiration dates.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** 2019 c 92 s 14 (uncodified) is amended to read as
7 follows:

8 Sections 1, 5, 8, and 11 of this act expire July 1, ((2023))
9 2024.

10 **Sec. 2.** RCW 16.57.460 and 2019 c 92 s 13 are each amended to
11 read as follows:

12 (1) The department shall submit a livestock inspection program
13 report pursuant to RCW 43.01.036 by September 1, 2020, and annually
14 thereafter, to the appropriate committees of the legislature having
15 oversight over agriculture and fiscal matters. The report must also
16 be submitted to the livestock identification advisory committee
17 created in RCW 16.57.015. The report must include amounts collected,
18 a report on program expenditures, and any recommendations for making
19 the program more efficient, improving the program, or modifying
20 livestock inspection fees to cover the costs of the program. The

1 report must also address the financial status of the program,
2 including whether there is a need to review fees so that the program
3 continues to be supported by fees.

4 (2) This section expires July 1, (~~2023~~) 2024.
