- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes the statewide
- 6 broadband office's objective of scalability while appreciating that a
- 7 digital economy will continue to drive higher and higher speeds.
- 8 Therefore, the legislature intends to move towards adequate
- 9 connectivity in terms of the needs of economic development,
- 10 education, and telehealth services.

- 16 (1) "Board" means the public works board established in RCW

- 18 (2) "Broadband" or "broadband service" means any service
- 19 providing advanced telecommunications capability and internet access
- 20 with transmission speeds that, at a minimum, provide ((twenty-five))

- 1 $\underline{100}$ megabits per second download and ((three)) $\underline{20}$ megabits per second 2 upload.
 - (3) "Broadband infrastructure" means networks of deployed telecommunications equipment and technologies necessary to provide high-speed internet access and other advanced telecommunications services to end users.
 - (4) "Department" means the department of commerce.

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- 8 (5) "Last mile infrastructure" means broadband infrastructure
 9 that serves as the final connection from a broadband service
 10 provider's network to the end-use customer's on-premises
 11 telecommunications equipment.
 - (6) "Local government" includes cities, towns, counties, municipal corporations, public port districts, public utility districts, quasi-municipal corporations, special purpose districts, and multiparty entities comprised of public entity members.
 - (7) "Middle mile infrastructure" means broadband infrastructure that links a broadband service provider's core network infrastructure to last mile infrastructure.
 - (8) "Office" means the governor's statewide broadband office established in RCW 43.330.532.
- 21 (9) "Tribe" means any federally recognized Indian tribe whose 22 traditional lands and territories included parts of Washington.
 - (10) "Unserved areas" means areas of Washington in which households and businesses lack access to broadband service, as defined by the office((, except that the state's definition for broadband service may not be actual speeds less than twenty-five megabits per second download and three megabits per second upload)).
