1       AN ACT Relating to creating the Rosa Franklin legislative  
2 internship program scholarship; amending RCW 43.79A.040; adding new  
3 sections to chapter 44.04 RCW; and adding a new section to chapter  
4 42.52 RCW.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6       NEW SECTION.   **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 44.04  
7 RCW to read as follows:

8       The secretary of the senate and the chief clerk of the house of  
9 representatives may administer and conduct the Rosa Franklin  
10 legislative internship program scholarship to provide resources for  
11 Washington students who participate in the legislative internship  
12 program of the senate and house of representatives. The scholarship  
13 program should provide assistance to students, based on financial  
14 need, who are accepted as legislative interns. The program is called  
15 the Rosa Franklin legislative internship program scholarship.

16       NEW SECTION.   **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 44.04  
17 RCW to read as follows:

18       (1) The secretary of the senate and the chief clerk of the house  
19 of representatives may solicit and accept gifts, grants, conveyances,  
20 bequests, and devises of real or personal property, or both, in trust

1 or otherwise, and sell, lease, exchange, or expend these donations or  
2 the proceeds, rents, profits, and income from the donations except as  
3 limited by the donor's terms. Any legislative member or legislative  
4 employee may solicit the same types of contributions for the  
5 secretary of the senate and the chief clerk of the house of  
6 representatives.

7 (2) Moneys received under this section may be used only for  
8 establishing and operating the Rosa Franklin legislative internship  
9 program scholarship authorized in section 1 of this act.

10 (3) Moneys received under this section must be deposited in the  
11 legislative internship program scholarship account established in  
12 section 3 of this act.

13 (4) The secretary of the senate and the chief clerk of the house  
14 of representatives must adopt joint rules to govern and protect the  
15 receipt and expenditure of the proceeds.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 44.04  
17 RCW to read as follows:

18 The Rosa Franklin legislative internship program scholarship  
19 account is created in the custody of the state treasurer. All moneys  
20 received under section 2 of this act must be deposited in the  
21 account. Expenditures from the account may be made only for the  
22 purposes of the Rosa Franklin legislative internship program  
23 scholarship created in section 1 of this act. Only the secretary of  
24 the senate or the chief clerk of the house of representatives or  
25 their designee may authorize expenditures from the account. An  
26 appropriation is not required for expenditures, but the account is  
27 subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 42.52  
29 RCW to read as follows:

30 This chapter does not prohibit the secretary of the senate, the  
31 chief clerk of the house of representatives, or their designee from  
32 soliciting and accepting contributions to the Rosa Franklin  
33 legislative internship program scholarship account created in section  
34 3 of this act. Furthermore, this chapter does not prohibit any  
35 legislative member or legislative employee from soliciting gifts for  
36 the Rosa Franklin legislative internship program scholarship account.

1       **Sec. 5.** RCW 43.79A.040 and 2020 c 18 s 2 are each amended to  
2 read as follows:

3       (1) Money in the treasurer's trust fund may be deposited,  
4 invested, and reinvested by the state treasurer in accordance with  
5 RCW 43.84.080 in the same manner and to the same extent as if the  
6 money were in the state treasury, and may be commingled with moneys  
7 in the state treasury for cash management and cash balance purposes.

8       (2) All income received from investment of the treasurer's trust  
9 fund must be set aside in an account in the treasury trust fund to be  
10 known as the investment income account.

11       (3) The investment income account may be utilized for the payment  
12 of purchased banking services on behalf of treasurer's trust funds  
13 including, but not limited to, depository, safekeeping, and  
14 disbursement functions for the state treasurer or affected state  
15 agencies. The investment income account is subject in all respects to  
16 chapter 43.88 RCW, but no appropriation is required for payments to  
17 financial institutions. Payments must occur prior to distribution of  
18 earnings set forth in subsection (4) of this section.

19       (4)(a) Monthly, the state treasurer must distribute the earnings  
20 credited to the investment income account to the state general fund  
21 except under (b), (c), and (d) of this subsection.

22       (b) The following accounts and funds must receive their  
23 proportionate share of earnings based upon each account's or fund's  
24 average daily balance for the period: The 24/7 sobriety account, the  
25 Washington promise scholarship account, the Gina Grant Bull memorial  
26 legislative page scholarship account, the Rosa Franklin legislative  
27 internship program scholarship, the Washington advanced college  
28 tuition payment program account, the Washington college savings  
29 program account, the accessible communities account, the Washington  
30 achieving a better life experience program account, the community and  
31 technical college innovation account, the agricultural local fund,  
32 the American Indian scholarship endowment fund, the foster care  
33 scholarship endowment fund, the foster care endowed scholarship trust  
34 fund, the contract harvesting revolving account, the Washington state  
35 combined fund drive account, the commemorative works account, the  
36 county enhanced 911 excise tax account, the county road  
37 administration board emergency loan account, the toll collection  
38 account, the developmental disabilities endowment trust fund, the  
39 energy account, the fair fund, the family and medical leave insurance  
40 account, the fish and wildlife federal lands revolving account, the

1 natural resources federal lands revolving account, the food animal  
2 veterinarian conditional scholarship account, the forest health  
3 revolving account, the fruit and vegetable inspection account, the  
4 educator conditional scholarship account, the game farm alternative  
5 account, the GET ready for math and science scholarship account, the  
6 Washington global health technologies and product development  
7 account, the grain inspection revolving fund, the Washington history  
8 day account, the industrial insurance rainy day fund, the juvenile  
9 accountability incentive account, the law enforcement officers' and  
10 firefighters' plan 2 expense fund, the local tourism promotion  
11 account, the low-income home rehabilitation revolving loan program  
12 account, the multiagency permitting team account, the northeast  
13 Washington wolf-livestock management account, the produce railcar  
14 pool account, the regional transportation investment district  
15 account, the rural rehabilitation account, the Washington sexual  
16 assault kit account, the stadium and exhibition center account, the  
17 youth athletic facility account, the self-insurance revolving fund,  
18 the children's trust fund, the Washington horse racing commission  
19 Washington bred owners' bonus fund and breeder awards account, the  
20 Washington horse racing commission class C purse fund account, the  
21 individual development account program account, the Washington horse  
22 racing commission operating account, the life sciences discovery  
23 fund, the Washington state library-archives building account, the  
24 reduced cigarette ignition propensity account, the center for deaf  
25 and hard of hearing youth account, the school for the blind account,  
26 the Millersylvania park trust fund, the public employees' and  
27 retirees' insurance reserve fund, the school employees' benefits  
28 board insurance reserve fund, the public employees' and retirees'  
29 insurance account, the school employees' insurance account, the long-  
30 term services and supports trust account, the radiation perpetual  
31 maintenance fund, the Indian health improvement reinvestment account,  
32 the department of licensing tuition recovery trust fund, the student  
33 achievement council tuition recovery trust fund, the tuition recovery  
34 trust fund, the industrial insurance premium refund account, the  
35 mobile home park relocation fund, the natural resources deposit fund,  
36 the Washington state health insurance pool account, the federal  
37 forest revolving account, and the library operations account.

38 (c) The following accounts and funds must receive eighty percent  
39 of their proportionate share of earnings based upon each account's or  
40 fund's average daily balance for the period: The advance right-of-way

1 revolving fund, the advanced environmental mitigation revolving  
2 account, the federal narcotics asset forfeitures account, the high  
3 occupancy vehicle account, the local rail service assistance account,  
4 and the miscellaneous transportation programs account.

5 (d) Any state agency that has independent authority over accounts  
6 or funds not statutorily required to be held in the custody of the  
7 state treasurer that deposits funds into a fund or account in the  
8 custody of the state treasurer pursuant to an agreement with the  
9 office of the state treasurer shall receive its proportionate share  
10 of earnings based upon each account's or fund's average daily balance  
11 for the period.

12 (5) In conformance with Article II, section 37 of the state  
13 Constitution, no trust accounts or funds shall be allocated earnings  
14 without the specific affirmative directive of this section.
