- (c) Requiring, beginning January 1, 2026, all holders of an active

- 20 four-hour continuing education course of the topics of valuation bias
- 21 and fair housing laws and regulations as part of the continuing
- 22 education requirement pursuant to rules adopted by the director.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4.
- 25 (1) This act takes effect upon the adoption of the administrative
- 26 rules required in section 3 of this act.

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- 1 (2) The department must provide written notice of the effective 2 date of this section to affected parties, the chief clerk of the house 3 of representatives, the secretary of the senate, the office of the 4 code reviser, and others as deemed appropriate by the department."

EFFECT:

- Requires the Department of Licensing (Department) to adopt rules to require: (1) Beginning January 1, 2024, that all applying to become a state-registered or state-certified real estate appraiser or trainee complete a seven-hour course and examination on valuation bias and fair housing laws and regulations in order to become registered, licensed, or certified; (2) Prior to January 1, 2025, that state-registered and state-certified real estate appraisers complete a seven-hour continuing education course on valuation bias and fair housing laws and regulations; and (3) Beginning January 1, 2026, all state-registered and state-certified real estate appraisers complete a four-hour continuing education course on valuation bias and fair housing laws and regulations.
- Makes the effective date of the act contingent upon when the Department adopts the required rules for adding valuation bias and fair housing laws and regulation training.
- Requires the Department to notify the affected parties of the effective date of the act.

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
