EFFECT: Maintains the requirement for members of the clergy to report child abuse or neglect, but excludes from that requirement to report child abuse or neglect information that a member of the clergy obtains in the member's professional character as a religious or spiritual advisor when the information is obtained solely in the context of a penitential communication. "Penitential communication" is defined to mean a communication that is: (1) communicated through spoken word; (2) made privately to a member of the clergy; (3) intended by the communicant to be an act of contrition or a matter of conscience; (4) intended by both parties to be confidential at the time the communication is made; and (5) made in the manner and context that places the member of the clergy specifically and strictly under a level of confidentiality that is considered inviolate by religious doctrine of the member of the clergy.
