- 3 "Sec. 1. RCW 50A.25.040 and 2019 c 13 s 73 are each amended to 4 read as follows:
- 5 (1) An individual shall have access to all records and information concerning that individual held by the department unless the information is exempt from disclosure under RCW 42.56.410.
 - (2) An employer shall have access to:
- 9 (a) Its own records relating to any claim or determination for 10 family or medical leave benefits by an individual;
- 11 (b) Records and information relating to a decision to allow or 12 deny benefits if the decision is based on material information 13 provided by the employer; and
- 14 (c) Records and information related to that employer's premium 15 assessment.
- 16 (3) (a) Any interested party may have access to the following
 17 records and information related to an employee's paid family or
 18 medical leave claim:
 - (i) Type of leave being taken;
- 20 <u>(ii) Requested duration of leave including the approved dates of</u> 21 <u>leave; and</u>
- 22 <u>(iii) Whether the employee was approved for benefits and was paid</u> 23 benefits for any given week.
- 24 <u>(b) Any information provided under this subsection shall be</u>
 25 <u>considered accurate to the extent possible based on information</u>
 26 available to the department at the time the request is processed.
- 27 (c) Any information provided under this subsection may only be
 28 used for the purpose of administering internal employer leave or
 29 benefit practices under established employer policies. The department
 30 may investigate unauthorized uses of records and information obtained
 31 under this subsection in accordance with RCW 50A.40.010.

- 1 (d) For the purposes of this subsection, "interested party" means a current employer, a current employer's third-party administrator, 2 or an employee. "Interested party" may be specified further in rule 3 by the department. 4
 - (4) The department may disclose records and information deemed confidential under this chapter to a third party acting on behalf of an individual or employer that would otherwise be eligible to receive records under subsection (1) or (2) of this section when the department receives a signed release from the individual or employer.
- The release must include a statement: 10
- 11 (a) Specifically identifying the information that is to be 12 disclosed;
- 13 (b) That state government files will be accessed to obtain that 14 information;
- (c) Of the specific purpose or purposes for which the information 15 16 is sought and a statement that information obtained under the release 17 will only be used for that purpose or purposes; and
- 18 (d) Indicating all the parties who may receive the information 19 disclosed.
- 20 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act takes effect January 1, 2024."

EFFECT: Removes the following from the list of information an interested party may access with respect to an employee's paid family or medical leave claim: Remaining hours of leave available in the employee's entitlement; weekly benefit amount; and actual benefits paid and hours claimed. Instead, allows an interested party to access information as to whether the employee was approved for benefits and was paid benefits for any given week.
