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On page 7, beginning on line 1, after "line" strike all material through "43.135.041." on line 5 and insert "1 of the title, after "to" strike the remainder of the title and insert "creating the blue 5 ribbon task force on advisory votes; adding a new section to chapter 29A.72 RCW; adding a new section; and providing an expiration date."

EFFECT: Replaces all language from the underlying bill which abolished advisory votes and required the creation of a website with information about the state budget and revenue-generating measures and some of the statement of legislative intent with provisions for the creation of a blue ribbon task force to provide recommendations on improving the process for gathering public input on legislation that raises taxes or fees.

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
