EFFECT: Requires voter registration applications to include a check box indicating that the applicant, excluding voters described in the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act and Article 6, Section 3 of the state constitution, would like their ballot forwarded to an out of state residence and an attestation that the applicant resides out of state less than 50 percent of the year.
