**Background:** 

This analysis was prepared by non-partisan legislative staff for the use of legislative members in their deliberations. This analysis is not part of the legislation nor does it constitute a statement of legislative intent.

Washington's state government operates on a fiscal biennium that begins July 1 of each odd-numbered year. Supplemental budgets are typically enacted in each of the following two years after the adoption of a biennial budget. Appropriations are made in the biennial and supplemental transportation budgets for the operation and capital expenses of the state transportation agencies and programs.

The 2023-25 State Transportation Appropriations Act (Transportation Budget) appropriated a total of \$13.5 billion from a number of transportation accounts.

### **Summary of Substitute Bill:**

House Bill 2134 increases appropriations for the 2023-25 fiscal biennium by \$833 million. Fund transfers and other changes to the 2023-25 Transportation Budget are also made.

## Substitute Bill Compared to Original Bill:

The substitute bill decreases appropriations by \$737 million compared to levels provided in the original bill.
