HOUSE BILL 1520

State of Washington 68th Legislature 2023 Regular Session

- AN ACT Relating to fentanyl; amending RCW 69.50.4013 and 9.94A.518; reenacting and amending RCW 13.40.0357; creating new sections; prescribing penalties; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. According to a recent study of provisional 7 data collected by the United States centers for disease control and 8 prevention, overdose from fentanyl is now the leading cause of death 9 of Americans between the ages of 18 and 45. Washington is not immune 10 from the opioid epidemic. Fentanyl has had a staggering effect on its 11 communities, and fentanyl-related overdoses are increasing across the 12 state. Under current law, possession of fentanyl is classified as a 13 simple misdemeanor, which is the lowest criminal penalty available, 14 and on July 1st of this year, the current law provision will expire 15 and Washington will return to its former law, which has been deemed 16 unconstitutional. This is an insufficient criminal justice system 17 response to this extremely dangerous drug. The legislature intends to fix the constitutional defect in the law going forward and restore 18 19 the felony penalties that were previously in place for possession of 20 fentanyl in order to reflect the extreme hazards associated with this 21 highly potent substance. Additionally, the legislature intends to

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- 1 launch a public outreach campaign to enhance public education on this
- 2 issue and connect affected individuals with available resources.

- **Sec. 2.** RCW 69.50.4013 and 2022 c 16 s 86 are each amended to 4 read as follows:
 - (1) It is unlawful for any person to possess a controlled substance unless the substance was obtained directly from, or pursuant to, a valid prescription or order of a practitioner while acting in the course of his or her professional practice, or except as otherwise authorized by this chapter.
- 10 (2) (a) Except as provided in RCW 69.50.4014 and (b) of this subsection, any person who violates this section is guilty of a class 12 C felony punishable under chapter 9A.20 RCW.
 - (b) Any person who violates this section by knowingly possessing fentanyl is guilty of a class C felony punishable according to chapter 9A.20 RCW.
 - (3) (a) The possession, by a person ((twenty-one)) <u>21</u> years of age or older, of useable cannabis, cannabis concentrates, or cannabis-infused products in amounts that do not exceed those set forth in RCW 69.50.360(3) is not a violation of this section, this chapter, or any other provision of Washington state law.
 - (b) The possession of cannabis, useable cannabis, cannabis concentrates, and cannabis-infused products being physically transported or delivered within the state, in amounts not exceeding those that may be established under RCW 69.50.385(3), by a licensed employee of a common carrier when performing the duties authorized in accordance with RCW 69.50.382 and 69.50.385, is not a violation of this section, this chapter, or any other provision of Washington state law.
 - (4) (a) The delivery by a person ((twenty-one)) 21 years of age or older to one or more persons ((twenty-one)) 21 years of age or older, during a single ((twenty-four)) 21 hour period, for noncommercial purposes and not conditioned upon or done in connection with the provision or receipt of financial consideration, of any of the following cannabis products, is not a violation of this section, this chapter, or any other provisions of Washington state law:
 - (i) One-half ounce of useable cannabis;
 - (ii) Eight ounces of cannabis-infused product in solid form;
- 38 (iii) Thirty-six ounces of cannabis-infused product in liquid 39 form; or

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1	(iv) Three and one-half grams of cannabis concentrates.
2	(b) The act of delivering cannabis or a cannabis product as
3	authorized under this subsection (4) must meet one of the following
4	requirements:
5	(i) The delivery must be done in a location outside of the view
6	of general public and in a nonpublic place; or
7	(ii) The cannabis or cannabis product must be in the original
8	packaging as purchased from the cannabis retailer.
9	(5) No person under ((twenty-one)) <u>21</u> years of age may possess,
10	manufacture, sell, or distribute cannabis, cannabis-infused products,
11	or cannabis concentrates, regardless of THC concentration. This does
12	not include qualifying patients with a valid authorization.
13	(6) The possession by a qualifying patient or designated provider
14	of cannabis concentrates, useable cannabis, cannabis-infused
15	products, or plants in accordance with chapter 69.51A RCW is not a
16	violation of this section, this chapter, or any other provision of
17	Washington state law.

9 ADJUDICATIONS

- NOTE: References in the grid to days or weeks mean periods of confinement. "LS" means "local sanctions" as defined in RCW 13.40.020.
- 13 (1) The vertical axis of the grid is the current offense 14 category. The current offense category is determined by the offense 15 of adjudication.
 - (2) The horizontal axis of the grid is the number of prior adjudications included in the juvenile's criminal history. Each prior felony adjudication shall count as one point. Each prior violation, misdemeanor, and gross misdemeanor adjudication shall count as 1/4 point. Fractional points shall be rounded down.
 - (3) The standard range disposition for each offense is determined by the intersection of the column defined by the prior adjudications and the row defined by the current offense category.
 - (4) RCW 13.40.180 applies if the offender is being sentenced for more than one offense.
 - (5) A current offense that is a violation is equivalent to an offense category of E. However, a disposition for a violation shall not include confinement.

OR

OPTION B31 **SUSPENDED DISPOSITION ALTERNATIVE**

(1) If the offender is subject to a standard range disposition involving confinement by the department, the court may impose the standard range and suspend the disposition on condition that the offender comply with one or more local sanctions and any educational or treatment requirement. The treatment programs provided to the

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- offender must be either research-based best practice programs as identified by the Washington state institute for public policy or the joint legislative audit and review committee, or for chemical dependency treatment programs or services, they must be evidencebased or research-based best practice programs. For the purposes of this subsection:
 - (a) "Evidence-based" means a program or practice that has had multiple site random controlled trials across heterogeneous populations demonstrating that the program or practice is effective for the population; and
 - (b) "Research-based" means a program or practice that has some research demonstrating effectiveness, but that does not yet meet the standard of evidence-based practices.
 - (2) If the offender fails to comply with the suspended disposition, the court may impose sanctions pursuant to RCW 13.40.200 or may revoke the suspended disposition and order the disposition's execution.
 - (3) An offender is ineligible for the suspended disposition option under this section if the offender:
 - (a) Is adjudicated of an A+ or A++ offense;

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- 21 (b) Is fourteen years of age or older and is adjudicated of one 22 or more of the following offenses:
- 23 (i) A class A offense, or an attempt, conspiracy, or solicitation 24 to commit a class A offense;
 - (ii) Manslaughter in the first degree (RCW 9A.32.060);
- (iii) Assault in the second degree (RCW 9A.36.021), extortion in the first degree (RCW 9A.56.120), kidnapping in the second degree (RCW 9A.40.030), drive-by shooting (RCW 9A.36.045), vehicular homicide (RCW 46.61.520), hit and run death (RCW 46.52.020(4)(a)), or manslaughter 2 (RCW 9A.32.070); or
