- 1 AN ACT Relating to removing party preferences from the ballot and
- 2 voters' pamphlet; and amending RCW 29A.52.112, 29A.04.110,
- 3 29A.32.032, 29A.24.031, and 42.17A.320.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29A.52.112 and 2014 c 7 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
 - (1) A primary is a first stage in the public process by which voters elect candidates to public office.
- 9 (2) Whenever candidates for a partisan office are to be elected, 10 the general election must be preceded by a primary conducted under 11 this chapter. Based upon votes cast at the primary, the top two 12 candidates will be certified as qualified to appear on the general 13 election ballot, unless only one candidate qualifies as provided in 14 RCW 29A.36.170.
- 15 (3) No primary may be held for any single county partisan office 16 to fill an unexpired term if, after the last day allowed for 17 candidates to withdraw, only one candidate has filed for the 18 position.
- 19 (4) For partisan office, ((if a candidate has expressed a party
 20 preference on the declaration of candidacy, then that preference will
 21 be shown after the name of the candidate on the primary and general

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- election ballots as set forth in rules of the secretary of state. A
 candidate may choose to express no party preference. Any party
 preferences are shown for the information of voters only and may in
 no way limit the options available to voters)) any party preference
 that a candidate chooses to identify with or express may not appear
 on the primary or general election ballot.
- **Sec. 2.** RCW 29A.04.110 and 2005 c 2 s 4 are each amended to read 8 as follows:

"Partisan office" means ((a public office for which a candidate may indicate a political party preference on his or her declaration of candidacy and have that preference appear on the primary and general election ballot in conjunction with his or her name. The following are partisan offices)):

- (1) United States senator and United States representative;
- 15 (2) All state offices, including legislative, except (a) judicial offices and (b) the office of superintendent of public instruction;
 - (3) All county offices except (a) judicial offices and (b) those offices for which a county home rule charter provides otherwise.
- Any party preference that a candidate chooses to identify with or express may not appear on the primary or general election ballot.
- **Sec. 3.** RCW 29A.32.032 and 2005 c 2 s 11 are each amended to 22 read as follows:

The text included in the voters' pamphlet ((must also)) by the secretary of state may not contain ((the)) a candidate's political party preference or independent status ((where)), even when a candidate appearing on the ballot has expressed or identified with such a preference ((on his or her declaration of candidacy)). Any candidate wishing to express the candidate's party preference or independent status in a voters' pamphlet may do so as part of the candidate's candidate statement.

Sec. 4. RCW 29A.24.031 and 2013 c 11 s 31 are each amended to 32 read as follows:

A candidate who desires to have his or her name printed on the ballot for election to an office other than president of the United States, vice president of the United States, or an office for which ownership of property is a prerequisite to voting shall complete and file a declaration of candidacy. The secretary of state shall adopt,

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- by rule, a declaration of candidacy form for the office of precinct committee officer and a separate standard form for candidates for all other offices filing under this chapter. Included on the standard form shall be:
 - (1) A place for the candidate to declare that he or she is a registered voter within the jurisdiction of the office for which he or she is filing, and the address at which he or she is registered;

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- 8 (2) A place for the candidate to indicate the position for which 9 he or she is filing;
- 10 (3) ((A place for the candidate to state a party preference, if 11 the office is a partisan office;
 - (4))) A place for the candidate to indicate the amount of the filing fee accompanying the declaration of candidacy or for the candidate to indicate that he or she is filing a filing fee petition in lieu of the filing fee under RCW 29A.24.091;
 - $((\frac{5}{}))$ $\underline{(4)}$ A place for the candidate to sign the declaration of candidacy, stating that the information provided on the form is true and swearing or affirming that he or she will support the Constitution and laws of the United States and the Constitution and laws of the state of Washington.
 - In the case of a declaration of candidacy filed electronically, submission of the form constitutes agreement that the information provided with the filing is true, that he or she will support the Constitutions and laws of the United States and the state of Washington, and that he or she agrees to electronic payment of the filing fee established in RCW 29A.24.091.
- 27 The secretary of state may require any other information on the 28 form he or she deems appropriate to facilitate the filing process.
- 29 **Sec. 5.** RCW 42.17A.320 and 2019 c 261 s 3 are each amended to 30 read as follows:
 - (1) All written political advertising, whether relating to candidates or ballot propositions, shall include the sponsor's name and address. All radio and television political advertising, whether relating to candidates or ballot propositions, shall include the sponsor's name. The use of an assumed name for the sponsor of electioneering communications, independent expenditures, or political advertising shall be unlawful. ((For partisan office, if a candidate has expressed a party or independent preference on the declaration of candidacy, that party or independent designation shall be clearly

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identified in electioneering communications, independent expenditures, or political advertising.))

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- (2) In addition to the information required by subsection (1) of this section, except as specifically addressed in subsections (4) and (5) of this section, all political advertising undertaken as an independent expenditure or an electioneering communication by a person or entity other than a bona fide political party must include as part of the communication:
- 9 (a) The statement: "No candidate authorized this ad. It is paid 10 for by (name, address, city, state)";
 - (b) If the sponsor is a political committee, the statement: "Top Five Contributors," followed by a listing of the names of the five persons making the largest contributions as determined by RCW 42.17A.350(1); and if necessary, the statement "Top Three Donors to PAC Contributors," followed by a listing of the names of the three individuals or entities, other than political committees, making the largest aggregated contributions as determined by RCW 42.17A.350(2); and
- 19 (c) If the sponsor is a political committee established, 20 maintained, or controlled directly, or indirectly through the 21 formation of one or more political committees, by an individual, 22 corporation, union, association, or other entity, the full name of 23 that individual or entity.
- 24 (3) The information required by subsections (1) and (2) of this section shall:
 - (a) Appear on the first page or fold of the written advertisement or communication in at least ten-point type, or in type at least ten percent of the largest size type used in a written advertisement or communication directed at more than one voter, such as a billboard or poster, whichever is larger;
 - (b) Not be subject to the half-tone or screening process; and
 - (c) Be set apart from any other printed matter. No text may be before, after, or immediately adjacent to the information required by subsections (1) and (2) of this section.
 - (4) In an independent expenditure or electioneering communication transmitted via television or other medium that includes a visual image, the following statement must either be clearly spoken, or appear in print and be visible for at least four seconds, appear in letters greater than four percent of the visual screen height on a solid black background on the entire bottom one-third of the

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1 television or visual display screen, or bottom one-fourth of the screen if the sponsor does not have or is otherwise not required to 2 list its top five contributors, and have a reasonable color contrast 3 with the background: "No candidate authorized this ad. Paid for by 4 (name, city, state)." If the advertisement or communication is 5 6 undertaken by a nonindividual other than a party organization, then the following notation must also be included: "Top Five Contributors" 7 followed by a listing of the names of the five persons making the 8 largest aggregate contributions as determined by RCW 42.17A.350(1); 9 if necessary, the statement "Top Three Donors to PAC 10 Contributors," followed by a listing of the names of the three 11 12 individuals or entities other than political committees making the largest aggregate contributions to political committees as determined 13 by RCW 42.17A.350(2). Abbreviations may be used to describe 14 contributing entities if the full name of the entity has been clearly 15 16 spoken previously during the broadcast advertisement.

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- The following statement shall be clearly spoken in an independent expenditure or electioneering communication transmitted by a method that does not include a visual image: "No candidate authorized this ad. Paid for by (name, city, state)." If the independent expenditure or electioneering communication is undertaken a nonindividual other than a party organization, then the following statement must also be included: "Top Five Contributors" followed by a listing of the names of the five persons making the largest contributions as determined by RCW 42.17A.350(1); and if necessary, the statement "Top Three Donors to PAC Contributors," followed by a listing of the names of the three individuals or entities, other than political committees, making the largest aggregate contributions to political committees as determined by RCW 42.17A.350(2). Abbreviations may be used to describe contributing entities if the full name of the entity has been clearly spoken previously during the broadcast advertisement.
- (6) Political advertising costing one thousand dollars or more supporting or opposing ballot measures sponsored by a political committee must include the information on the top five contributors and top three contributors, other than political committees, as required by RCW 42.17A.350. A series of political advertising sponsored by the same political committee, each of which is under one thousand dollars, must include the top five contributors and top three contributors, other than political committees, as required by

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1 RCW 42.17A.350 once their cumulative value reaches one thousand 2 dollars or more.

- (7) Political yard signs are exempt from the requirements of this section that the sponsor's name and address, and the top five contributors and top three PAC contributors as required by RCW 42.17A.350, be listed on the advertising. In addition, the public disclosure commission shall, by rule, exempt from the identification requirements of this section forms of political advertising such as campaign buttons, balloons, pens, pencils, sky-writing, inscriptions, and other forms of advertising where identification is impractical.
- (8) For the purposes of this section, "yard sign" means any outdoor sign with dimensions no greater than eight feet by four feet.

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
