HOUSE BILL 1838

State of Washington 68th Legislature 2023 Regular Session

Read first time 02/20/23. Referred to Committee on Transportation.

AN ACT Relating to transferring the responsibilities for the transportation revenue forecast for the transportation budget to the economic and revenue forecast council; amending RCW 82.33.010 and 82.33.040; reenacting and amending RCW 82.33.020; and repealing RCW 43.88.125.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 Sec. 1. RCW 82.33.010 and 2012 1st sp.s. c 8 s 2 are each 8 amended to read as follows:

9 (1) (a) The economic and revenue forecast council is hereby 10 created. The council shall consist of ((two individuals appointed by 11 the governor, the state treasurer, and four)) the following members:

12 13 (i) The director of the office of financial management;

<u>(ii) The state treasurer;</u>

14 <u>(iii) Four</u> individuals, one of whom is appointed by the 15 chairperson of each of the two largest political caucuses in the 16 senate and house of representatives((. The)), who shall sit with the 17 <u>council and serve as voting members only at such time as the</u> 18 <u>consideration of the economic and revenue forecast for the operating</u> 19 <u>budget and the state budget outlook;</u>

20 <u>(iv) The director of the department of revenue, who shall sit</u> 21 <u>with the council and serve as a voting member only at such times as</u> 1 <u>the consideration of the economic and revenue forecast for the</u> 2 <u>operating budget and the state budget outlook;</u>

3 <u>(v) The chair and ranking member of the house transportation</u> 4 committee, and chair and ranking member of the senate transportation 5 committee, who shall sit with the council and serve as voting members 6 only at such time as the consideration of the transportation revenue 7 forecast for the transportation budget; and

8 <u>(vi) The director of the department of licensing, who shall sit</u> 9 <u>with the council and serve as a voting member only at such times as</u> 10 <u>the consideration of the transportation revenue forecast for the</u> 11 <u>transportation budget.</u>

12 (b) Except as provided in (c) of this subsection, the chair of 13 the council shall be selected from among the four caucus appointees. 14 The council may select such other officers as the members deem 15 necessary.

16 (c) The chair of the council when conducting business related to 17 the transportation revenue forecast for the transportation budget 18 shall be selected from among the four legislative appointees from the 19 transportation budget committees.

20 (d) A quorum of the council consists of a majority of members
21 appointed for the business to be conducted.

(2) The council shall employ an economic and revenue forecast 22 23 supervisor to supervise the preparation of all economic and revenue forecasts and the presentation of state budget outlooks. As used in 24 25 this chapter, "supervisor" means the economic and revenue forecast supervisor. Approval by an affirmative vote of at least ((five)) 26 eight members of the council is required for any decisions regarding 27 28 employment of the supervisor. For purposes of this vote, all members of the council set forth in subsection (1)(a) of this section are 29 voting members. Employment of the supervisor shall terminate after 30 31 each term of three years. At the end of the first year of each three-32 year term the council shall consider extension of the supervisor's term by one year. The council may fix the compensation of the 33 34 The supervisor shall employ staff sufficient to supervisor. accomplish the purposes of this section. 35

36 (3) The economic and revenue forecast council shall oversee 37 ((the)):

(a) The preparation of and approve, by an affirmative vote of at
 least five members <u>eligible to vote for the economic and revenue</u>
 forecast for the operating budget, the official, optimistic, and

pessimistic state economic and revenue forecasts prepared under RCW
82.33.020; and

3 (b) The preparation of and approval, by an affirmative vote of at 4 least five members of those members eligible to vote for, the 5 transportation revenue forecast for the transportation budget 6 prepared under RCW 82.33.020.

7 If the council is unable to approve ((a)) <u>any</u> forecast before a 8 date required in RCW 82.33.020, the supervisor shall submit the 9 forecast without approval and the forecast shall have the same effect 10 as if approved by the council.

(4) The economic and revenue forecast council shall oversee the 11 12 preparation of and approve, by an affirmative vote of at least five members of those members eligible to vote for, the state budget 13 outlook prepared under RCW 82.33.060. If the council is unable to 14 approve a state budget outlook before a date required in RCW 15 16 82.33.060, the supervisor shall submit the outlook prepared under RCW 17 82.33.060 without approval and the outlook shall have the same effect 18 as if approved by the council.

(5) A councilmember who does not cast an affirmative vote for 19 approval of the official economic and revenue forecast ((or)) for the 20 operating budget, the state budget outlook, or the transportation 21 22 revenue forecast for the transportation budget may request, and the 23 supervisor shall provide, an alternative economic and revenue forecast or state budget outlook based on assumptions specified by 24 25 the member including, for purposes of the state budget outlook, revenues to and expenditures from additional funds. 26

(6) Members of the economic and revenue forecast council shall serve without additional compensation but shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120 while attending sessions of the council or on official business authorized by the council. Nonlegislative members of the council shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

33 Sec. 2. RCW 82.33.020 and 2015 c 3 s 14 are each reenacted and 34 amended to read as follows:

35 (1) Four times each year the supervisor must prepare, subject to 36 the approval of the economic and revenue forecast council under RCW 37 82.33.010:

38 (a) An official state economic and revenue forecast;

1 (b) An unofficial state economic and revenue forecast based on 2 optimistic economic and revenue projections; ((and))

3 (c) An unofficial state economic and revenue forecast based on 4 pessimistic economic and revenue projections<u>; and</u>

5 <u>(d) Beginning with the September 2024 forecast, an official</u> 6 <u>transportation revenue forecast for the transportation budget. For</u> 7 <u>purposes of this subsection, the transportation revenue forecast for</u> 8 <u>the transportation budget includes, but is not limited to,</u> 9 <u>transportation taxes, vehicle fees, drivers' fees, fares and tolls,</u> 10 <u>and aircraft and vessel fees</u>.

(2) The supervisor must submit forecasts prepared under this 11 12 section, along with any unofficial forecasts provided under RCW 82.33.010, to the governor and the members of the ((committees on)) 13 14 ways and means committee of the senate and appropriations committee of the house of representatives and the chairs of the committees on 15 16 transportation of the senate and house of representatives, including 17 one copy to the staff of each of the committees, on or before 18 November 20th, February 20th in the even-numbered years, March 20th 19 in the odd-numbered years, June 27th, and September 27th. ((In fiscal year 2015, the March 20th forecast shall be submitted on or before 20 21 February 20, 2015.)) All forecasts must be based on the most recent economic and revenue forecast council economic forecast. All 22 23 forecasts must include both estimated receipts and estimated revenues in conformance with generally accepted accounting principles as 24 provided by RCW 43.88.037. In odd-numbered years, the period covered 25 26 by forecasts for the state general fund and related funds must cover the current fiscal biennium and the next ensuing fiscal biennium, and 27 28 the period for the transportation related funds must cover the current fiscal biennium and the next two ensuing fiscal biennia. In 29 even-numbered years, the period covered by the forecasts for the 30 31 state general fund and related funds shall be current fiscal and the 32 next two ensuing fiscal biennia, and the period for the transportation related funds shall be the current fiscal and the next 33 two ensuing fiscal biennia. 34

35 (3) All agencies of state government must provide to the 36 supervisor immediate access to all information relating to economic 37 and revenue forecasts. Revenue collection information must be 38 available to the supervisor the first business day following the 39 conclusion of each collection period.

1 (4) The economic and revenue forecast supervisor and staff must 2 ((colocate and)) share information, data, and files with the tax 3 research section of the department of revenue <u>and the department of</u> 4 <u>licensing</u> but may not duplicate the duties and functions of one 5 another.

6 (5) As part of its forecasts under subsection (1) of this 7 section, the supervisor must provide estimated revenue from tuition 8 fees as defined in RCW 28B.15.020.

The economic and revenue forecast council 9 must, (6)in consultation with the economic and revenue forecast work group 10 created in RCW 82.33.040, review the existing economic and revenue 11 12 forecast council revenue model, data, and methodologies and in light of recent economic changes, engage outside experts if necessary, and 13 recommend changes to the economic and revenue forecast council 14 revenue forecasting process to increase confidence and promote 15 16 accuracy in the revenue forecast. The recommendations are due by 17 September 30, 2012, and every five years thereafter.

18 Sec. 3. RCW 82.33.040 and 1986 c 158 s 23 are each amended to 19 read as follows:

(1) To promote the free flow of information and to promote 20 21 legislative input in the preparation of forecasts, immediate access 22 to all information relating to economic and revenue forecasts shall be available to the economic and revenue forecast work group, hereby 23 24 created. Revenue collection information shall be available to the 25 economic and revenue forecast work group the first business day following the ((conclusion of each collection period)) close of each 26 27 fiscal month. The economic and revenue forecast work group shall consist of one staff member selected by the executive head or 28 29 chairperson of each of the following agencies or committees:

(b) Office of financial management;

32 (c) Legislative evaluation and accountability program committee;

33 (d) Ways and means committee of the senate; ((and))

34 (e) ((Ways and means)) Appropriations committee of the house of 35 representatives;

36 (f) Transportation committee of the senate;

37 (g) Transportation committee of the house of representatives;

- 38 (h) Washington state department of transportation; and
- 39 (i) Department of licensing.

1 (2) The economic and revenue forecast work group shall provide technical support to the economic and revenue forecast council. 2 Meetings of the economic and revenue forecast work group may be 3 called by any member of the group for the purpose of assisting the 4 economic and revenue forecast council, reviewing the state economic 5 6 and revenue forecasts, or reviewing monthly revenue collection data or for any other purpose which may assist the economic and revenue 7 forecast council. 8

9 <u>(3) Staff members from the Washington state department of</u> 10 <u>transportation, department of licensing, transportation committee of</u> 11 <u>the senate, and transportation committee of the house of</u> 12 <u>representatives shall only provide technical support for the</u> 13 <u>transportation revenue forecast for the transportation budget.</u>
