AN ACT Relating to incentivizing cities and counties to attract and retain commissioned law enforcement officers; reenacting and amending RCW 43.101.200; adding new sections to chapter 82.14 RCW; and creating a new section.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. (1) The law enforcement profession is 6 7 challenging both physically and mentally, and coupled with the coronavirus pandemic and other significant events that have occurred 8 in recent years that have rapidly changed and shifted community 9 10 expectations of police, attraction and retention of law enforcement 11 officers has become increasingly difficult. The United States 12 department of justice issued a report in October 2023, with strategies aimed at helping law enforcement agencies increase the 13 number of law enforcement officers. The department of justice report 14 15 cited a 2023 report from the police executive research forum that 16 showed that police agencies are facing a historic crisis in hiring 17 and retaining law enforcement staff.

18 (2) The legislature recognizes the need for attracting and 19 retaining additional law enforcement officers in Washington. To 20 address this need, the legislature intends to authorize counties and 21 cities to impose a sales and use tax as a credit against the state sales and use tax to provide funding for attracting and retaining law
enforcement officers throughout the state.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 82.14 4 RCW to read as follows:

5 (1)(a) In accordance with the timeline established in section 3 6 of this act, a county or city legislative authority may impose a 7 sales and use tax in accordance with the terms of this chapter. The 8 rate of tax under this section is 0.10 percent of the selling price, 9 in the case of a sales tax, or value of the article used, in the case 10 of a use tax.

(b) For a city imposing the sales and use tax under this section, if the county in which the city is located also imposes the tax, the city sales and use tax must be credited against the county tax.

(2) The tax authorized in this section is in addition to any 14 15 other taxes authorized by law and must be collected from those persons who are taxable by the state under chapters 82.08 and 82.12 16 17 RCW upon the occurrence of any taxable event within the county. The tax authorized under this section is a credit against the state tax 18 under chapter 82.08 or 82.12 RCW. The department must perform the 19 20 collection of such taxes on behalf of the county or city at no cost to the county or city and the state treasurer must remit the tax to 21 the jurisdiction as provided in RCW 82.14.060. 22

(3) (a) Subject to (b) of this subsection, at least 50 percent of the money received under this section must be used solely for attracting and retaining additional commissioned law enforcement officers.

(b) The remaining percentage of the money received under this section in the current calendar year may be used for criminal justice purposes.

30 (4) For the purposes of this section, "criminal justice purposes" means activities that substantially assist the criminal justice 31 system, which may include circumstances where ancillary benefit to 32 the civil justice system occurs, and which includes domestic violence 33 services such as those provided by domestic violence programs, 34 35 community advocates, and legal advocates, as defined in RCW 70.123.020. After May 13, 2021, through December 31, 2024, criminal 36 37 justice purposes includes local government programs that have a 38 reasonable relationship to reducing the number of people interacting

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with the criminal justice system including, but not limited to,
reducing homelessness and improving behavioral health.

3NEW SECTION.Sec. 3.A new section is added to chapter 82.144RCW to read as follows:

5 Counties and cities may impose the sales and use tax authorized 6 in section 2 of this act as follows:

7 (1) By January 1, 2025, all counties and cities with a population 8 of 50,000 or less may impose the sales and use tax.

9 (2) By January 1, 2027, all counties and cities with a population 10 between 50,000 and 175,000 may impose the sales and use tax.

11 (3) By January 1, 2029, all counties and cities may impose the 12 sales and use tax.

13 Sec. 4. RCW 43.101.200 and 2023 c 475 s 931 and 2023 c 168 s 2 14 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

15 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, all law enforcement personnel, except volunteers, and reserve officers 16 whether paid or unpaid, initially employed on or after January 1, 17 1978, shall engage in basic law enforcement training which complies 18 19 with standards adopted by the commission pursuant to RCW 43.101.080. For personnel initially employed before January 1, 20 1990, such training shall be successfully completed during the first fifteen 21 months of employment of such personnel unless otherwise extended or 22 23 waived by the commission and shall be requisite to the continuation of such employment. Personnel initially employed on or after January 24 1, 1990, shall commence basic training during the first six months of 25 26 employment unless the basic training requirement is otherwise waived or extended by the commission. Successful completion of basic 27 training is requisite to the continuation of employment of such 28 29 personnel initially employed on or after January 1, 1990.

30 (2)(a) All law enforcement personnel who are limited authority 31 Washington peace officers and whose employment commences on or after 32 July 1, 2023, shall commence basic training during the first 12 33 months of employment unless the basic training requirement is 34 otherwise waived or extended by the commission. Successful completion 35 of basic training is requisite to the continuation of employment of 36 such personnel initially employed on or after July 1, 2023.

37 (b)(i) The commission shall review the training files of all law 38 enforcement personnel who are limited authority Washington peace

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1 officers, whose employment commenced prior to July 1, 2023, and who 2 have not successfully completed training that complies with standards 3 adopted by the commission, to determine what, if any, supplemental 4 training is required to appropriately carry out the officers' duties 5 and responsibilities.

6 (ii) Nothing in this section may be interpreted to require law 7 enforcement personnel who are limited authority Washington peace 8 officers, whose employment commenced prior to July 1, 2023, to 9 complete the basic law enforcement training academy as a condition of 10 continuing employment as a limited authority Washington peace 11 officer.

12 (iii) Law enforcement personnel who are limited authority 13 Washington peace officers are not required to complete the basic law 14 enforcement academy or an equivalent basic academy upon transferring 15 to a general authority Washington law enforcement agency or limited 16 authority Washington law enforcement agency, as defined in RCW 17 10.93.020, if they have:

(A) Been employed as a special agent with the Washington state gambling commission, been a natural resource investigator with the department of natural resources, been a liquor enforcement officer with the liquor and cannabis board, been an investigator with the office of the insurance commissioner, or been a park ranger with the Washington state parks and recreation commission, before or after July 1, 2023; and

(B) Received a certificate of successful completion from the basic law enforcement academy or the basic law enforcement equivalency academy and thereafter engaged in regular and commissioned law enforcement employment with an agency listed in (b)(iii)(A) of this subsection without a break or interruption in excess of 24 months; and

31 (C) Remained current with the in-service training requirements as32 adopted by the commission by rule.

(3) Except as provided in RCW 43.101.170, the commission shall 33 provide the aforementioned training and shall have the sole authority 34 to do so. The commission shall provide necessary facilities, 35 supplies, materials, and the board and room of noncommuting attendees 36 for seven days per week((, except during the 2017-2019, 2019-2021, 37 2021-2023, and 2023-2025 fiscal biennia when the employing, county, 38 39 city, or state law enforcement agency shall reimburse the commission 40 for twenty-five percent of the cost of training its personnel)).

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Additionally, to the extent funds are provided for this purpose, the 1 commission shall reimburse to participating law enforcement agencies 2 with ten or less full-time commissioned patrol officers the cost of 3 temporary replacement of each officer who is enrolled in basic law 4 enforcement training: PROVIDED, That such reimbursement shall include 5 6 only the actual cost of temporary replacement not to exceed the total amount of salary and benefits received by the replaced officer during 7 his or her training period: 8

9 PROVIDED FURTHER, That limited authority Washington law 10 enforcement agencies as defined in RCW 10.93.020 shall reimburse the 11 commission for the full cost of training their personnel.

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
