- 1 AN ACT Relating to encouraging and protecting the sport of rock
- 2 climbing by establishing climbing facility regulations and
- 3 requirements; amending RCW 67.42.010; adding a new chapter to Title
- 4 18 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that practicing the
- 7 sport of rock climbing in a climbing facility helps facilitate
- 8 equitable and adaptive access to physical activity that significantly
- 9 contributes to the Washington state recreational activity economy.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The definitions in this section apply
- 11 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires
- 12 otherwise.
- 13 (1) "Climbing facility" means a facility or premises that
- 14 contains a fixed, artificial climbing surface used by the public, not
- 15 located in an amusement park, carnival, family entertainment center,
- 16 or on public land, that is designed and built for the sport of
- 17 climbing.
- 18 (2) "Climbing facility operator" means a person or entity who
- 19 owns, manages, controls, directs, or has operational responsibility
- 20 for a climbing facility.

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- 1 (3) "Climbing facility participant" means a person in a climbing 2 facility for the purpose of engaging in the sport of climbing. 3 "Climbing facility participant" includes anyone utilizing a climbing 4 wall or personal protective equipment, belaying, or spectating in a 5 climbing facility.
- 6 (4) "Personal protective equipment" means harnesses, carabiners,
 7 belay devices, auto belay devices, ropes, and other items designed to
 8 protect a participant from injury while using a climbing facility.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Climbing facility operators shall comply 10 with indoor climbing industry custom and practice regarding the 11 operation of indoor climbing facilities, including:
- 12 (1) Posting clearly legible rules and warnings for climbing 13 facility participants in a conspicuous location in the climbing 14 facility; and
- 15 (2) Conducting inspections of the manufactured climbing walls on 16 a regular periodic basis.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Sections 2 and 3 of this act constitute a new chapter in Title 18 RCW.
- 19 **Sec. 5.** RCW 67.42.010 and 1993 c 203 s 2 are each amended to 20 read as follows:
- Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter.

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- (1) "Amusement structure" means electrical or mechanical devices or combinations of devices operated for revenue and to provide amusement or entertainment to viewers or audiences at carnivals, fairs, or amusement parks. "Amusement structure" also means a bungee jumping device regardless of where located. "Amusement structure" does not include games in which a member of the public must perform an act, nor concessions at which customers may make purchases.
- 30 (2) "Amusement ride" means any vehicle, boat, bungee jumping device, or other mechanical device moving upon or within a structure, 31 along cables or rails, through the air by centrifugal force or 32 otherwise, or across water, that is used to convey one or more 33 individuals for amusement, entertainment, diversion, or recreation. 34 "Amusement ride" includes, but is not limited to, devices commonly 35 known as skyrides, ferris wheels, carousels, parachute towers, 36 tunnels of love, bungee jumping devices, and roller coasters. 37

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1 "Amusement ride" does not include: (a) Conveyances for persons in recreational winter sports activities such as ski lifts, ski tows, j-2 bars, t-bars, and similar devices subject to regulation under chapter 3 ((70.88)) 79A.40 RCW; (b) any single-passenger coin-operated ride 4 that is manually, mechanically, or electrically operated and 5 6 customarily placed in a public location and that does not normally require the supervision or services of an operator; (c) nonmechanized 7 playground equipment, including but not limited to, swings, seesaws, 8 stationary spring-mounted animal features, rider-propelled merry-go-9 rounds, climbers, slides, trampolines, and physical fitness devices; 10 ((or)) (d) water slides; or (e) a fixed, artificial climbing surface 11 built for the sport of rock climbing used in a climbing facility. For 12 purposes of this subsection, "climbing facility" means a facility or 13 premises that contains a fixed, artificial climbing surface used by 14 the public, not located in an amusement park, carnival, family 15 entertainment center, or on public land, that is designed and built 16 17 for the sport of climbing.

- (3) "Department" means the department of labor and industries.
- 19 (4) "Insurance policy" means an insurance policy written by an 20 insurer authorized to do business in this state under Title 48 RCW.

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
