(3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
 state council of firefighters.

(4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license 28 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least 29 30 ((ten)) 10 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years 31 and (b) have documentation of service from the district of the 32 appropriate fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves 33 firefighting service before ((ten)) 10 years of service have been 34 completed, the volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license 35 plates to the department on the registration renewal date. If the 36 volunteer firefighter stays in service for at least ((ten)) 10 years and then leaves, the license plate may be retained by the former 37 38 volunteer firefighter and as long as the license plate is retained

1 for use the person will continue to pay the future registration 2 renewals. A qualifying volunteer firefighter may have no more than 3 one set of license plates per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per 4 applicant, for their personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter 5 is convicted of a violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license 6 plates must be surrendered upon conviction.

7 (5) The department shall not issue the Seattle NHL hockey special
8 license plate until the department receives signature sheets
9 satisfying the requirements identified in RCW 46.18.110(2)(f).

(5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to the Washington state leadership board solely for the purpose of administering the Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the Washington state leadership board under this subsection, at least ((ninety)) <u>90</u> percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

(6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners account may be provided to the Washington state leadership board solely for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the amounts received by the Washington state leadership board, at least ((ninety)) <u>90</u> percent must be applied towards services directly provided to youth participants.

35 (7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit 36 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in 37 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status 38 under 26 U.S.C.
