1 AN ACT Relating to minimum employment requirements for 2 paraeducators; and amending RCW 28A.413.040 and 28A.413.030.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.413.040 and 2018 c 153 s 1 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

(1) (a) A person working as a paraeducator for a school district
before or during the 2017-18 school year must meet the requirements
of subsection (2) of this section by the date of hire for the 2019-20
school year or any subsequent school year.

10 (b) A person who has not previously worked as a paraeducator for 11 a school district must meet the requirements of subsection (2) of 12 this section by the date of hire for the 2018-19 school year or any 13 subsequent school year.

14 (2) The minimum employment requirements for paraeducators are as 15 provided in this subsection. A paraeducator must:

16 (a) Be at least ((eighteen)) <u>18</u> years of age and hold a high 17 school diploma or its equivalent; and

18 (b) <u>Meet one of the following requirements:</u>

19 (i) Have received a passing ((grade)) score on ((the education 20 testing service paraeducator assessment)) one of the assessments 21 approved by the board; ((or)) 1 (ii) Hold an associate of arts degree; ((or))

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2 (iii) Have earned ((seventy-two)) <u>72</u> quarter credits or ((forty3 eight)) <u>48</u> semester credits at an institution of higher education; or
4 (iv) Have completed a registered apprenticeship program.

5 Sec. 2. RCW 28A.413.030 and 2017 c 237 s 4 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

(1) The paraeducator board has the following powers and duties:

8 (a) Based on the recommendations of the paraeducator work group 9 established in chapter 136, Laws of 2014, adopt: (i) Minimum 10 employment requirements for paraeducators, as described in RCW 11 28A.413.040; and (ii) paraeducator standards of practice, as 12 described in RCW 28A.413.050;

(b) Adopt one or more assessments that meet a rigorous standard of quality and can be used to demonstrate knowledge of, and the ability to assist in, instruction in reading, writing, and mathematics, as well as set a passing score for each assessment adopted. The board may develop assessments to meet the requirement of this subsection (1)(b);

19 (c) Establish requirements and policies for a general 20 paraeducator certificate, as described in RCW 28A.413.070;

(((c))) <u>(d)</u> Based on the recommendations of the paraeducator work group established in chapter 136, Laws of 2014, establish requirements and policies for subject matter certificates in English language learner and special education, as described in RCW 28A.413.080;

26 (((d))) <u>(e)</u> Based on the recommendations of the paraeducator work 27 group established in chapter 136, Laws of 2014, establish 28 requirements and policies for an advanced paraeducator certificate, 29 as described in RCW 28A.413.090;

30 (((e))) <u>(f)</u> By September 1, 2018, approve, and develop if 31 necessary, courses required to meet the provisions of this chapter, 32 where the courses are offered in a variety of means that will limit 33 cost and improve access;

34 (((f))) <u>(g)</u> Make policy recommendations, as necessary, for a 35 paraeducator career ladder that will increase opportunities for 36 paraeducator advancement through advanced education, professional 37 learning, and increased instructional responsibility;

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1 (((g))) <u>(h)</u> Collaborate with the office of the superintendent of 2 public instruction to adapt the electronic educator certification 3 process to include paraeducator certificates; and

4 (((h))) <u>(i)</u> Adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW that are 5 necessary for the effective and efficient implementation of this 6 chapter.

7 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall act as the 8 administrator of any such rules and have the power to issue any 9 paraeducator certificates and revoke the same in accordance with 10 board rules.

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
